Secondary Schools Closed to Students on Wednesday, December 18, 2019 due to OSSTF Strike

Notice has been provided by OSSTF, the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation, that all YRDSB secondary school teachers will be conducting a one day strike affecting secondary schools on **Wednesday**, **December 18**, **2019**.


