Course Selection Due on Monday

A final reminder that **course selection is due on Monday**, **February 24.** Students are to make their selections <u>online</u> and then bring to school a copy of their selections printed from <u>my</u> <u>blueprint</u> that has been signed by a parent/guardian.

Literacy Test Update

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) will be written on **March 31st**. This is an EQAO test written by students pursuing an Ontario Secondary School Diploma who are in their Grade 10 year or those in their Grade 11 or 12 year who have not yet completed their literacy requirement for graduation.

The test will be a "pen and paper" test with no online option. Accommodations for students with learning exceptionalities will be arranged through the Special Education Department in line with the student's IEP.

March 31st is the only time the test is offered during this school year so **student attendance is essential**. This is a graduation requirement; any students eligible to write this year who are absent from the test will forfeit the opportunity to write this year and **must** write the following year.

Preparations:

The Literacy Committee is working to ensure our students feel well prepared for the test. Students writing the test met with our Literacy Teachers to register on the "KCSS Literacy Learning" Moodle in September. This Moodle is a one-stop-shop for at-home literacy test preparation. Students are highly encouraged to use the Moodle for practice and preparation for the test. Parents are encouraged to look at this Moodle with their students and to support their practice while at home. Practice booklets were also made available through School Cash Online.

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In September, students wrote an online practice test. This provided a sample of their work to the Literacy Committee. These tests were marked and feedback was provided by email to each student and parents/guardians. Parents and guardians are encouraged to discuss the results with their student, and to encourage practice in any areas that require improvement.

Our student-led Literacy Collaborative has run two workshops with the Grade 10s so far this year. The focus of one workshop was effective reading strategies, and the other was writing a series of paragraphs expressing an opinion. In March the Literacy Collaborative will meet with students again to present two additional workshops. The focus will be writing news reports and an electronic overview of the test.

Ms. Moretti and Ms. Morris will meet with students early in March to provide necessary introductory information to students, and again late in March to confirm last minute details.
