Important OSSLT Update

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) will be written on **March 27th**. The test will be a "pen and paper" test with no online option. Accommodations for students with SEA equipment will be arranged through the Special Education Department as per usual practice.

March 27th is the only time the test is offered during this school year so **student attendance is essential**. As this is a graduation requirement, any students eligible to write this year who are absent from the test will forfeit the opportunity to write this year and **must** write the following year.

This test is written by students pursuing an Ontario Secondary School Diploma who are in their Grade 10 year or those in their Grade 11 or 12 year who have not yet completed their literacy requirement for graduation. On March 27th, there will be no classes running for students who are not writing the test, with the exception of our non-credit bearing Autism Community Class program.

EQAO has removed previous restrictions around extra time for the test. Students no longer need to be English Language Learners or have an IEP to be allowed additional time to write the test. Test writers will receive a letter in homeroom to share with parents regarding extra time. If you and your son/daughter anticipates the need for extra time, please complete the letter and return it to Ms. Morris (Student Success) or Ms. Littlejohn (Library).

The Literacy Committee is working to ensure our students feel well prepared for the test. Students writing the test met with our Literacy Teachers to register on the "KCSS Literacy Learning" Moodle in September. This Moodle is a one-stop-shop for at-home literacy test preparation. Students are highly encouraged to use the Moodle for practice and preparation for the test. Parents are encouraged to look at this Moodle with their students and to support their practice while at home.

OSSLT Update Continued...

In September, students wrote an online practice test. This provided a sample of their work to the Literacy Committee. These tests were marked and feedback was provided by email to each student and parents/guardians. Parents and guardians are encouraged to discuss the results with their student, and to encourage practice in any areas that require improvement.

All school classroom teachers will be working with students to review the necessary skills for successful completion of the test. Our "Lit Blitz" will kick off on March 4th. Grade 10 students will be participating in a series of lessons, including a full day in-school event on March 6th, focusing on areas of the test that students traditionally find challenging. This will include: the three reading and the three writing criteria evaluated on the test.





Well done team.












Information on School Bus Cancellation

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis
 will not operate. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs.
 Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas encompassing
 several municipal boundaries which prevents the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or
 zone methodology.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport
 their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in
 the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school
 by parents will require the same transportation home.
