Green Team: Earth Hour Reminder



Earth Hour is on March 27, from 8:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Every year, at 8:30 pm on the last Saturday of March, millions of people across the world join in raising awareness of the issues facing our planet. Earth Hour is more than just an hour for the planet - it's a movement for *our future*. It's more than just a symbol of support - it's a catalyst for urgent change.

According to Hydro One, last year's "Earth Hour" resulted in a direct power savings for the province of Ontario of 202 megawatts – or enough to power the city of Belleville, Ontario. That also translates to just over 140 metric tons of carbon dioxide being released (or not) into our atmosphere. "Earth Hour helps to remind electricity consumers that small conservation acts can lead to large benefits." Although we celebrate earth hour each year, we encourage everyone to continue to reduce the amount of electricity we use on a regular basis!




