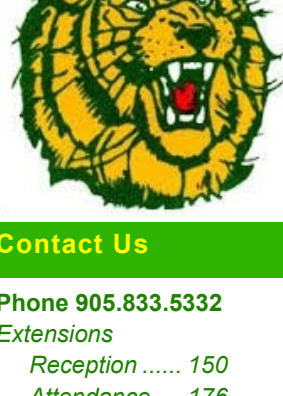

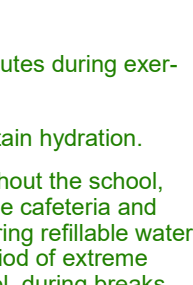

## September 26: Heat Warning

Environment Canada has issued a **Heat Warning** for Southern Ontario, which is expected to continue tomorrow. It is expected that the humidex value could reach 40°C or more. We encourage students to:

- wear light, loose clothing;
- drink of water for re-hydration;
- avoid carbonated drinks with caffeine, as they promote excessive fluid loss;
- drink water before exercise and every 15-20 minutes during exercise; and
- drink water regularly throughout the day to maintain hydration.

In addition to traditional water fountains found throughout the school, KCSS has two water bottle refilling stations: one in the cafeteria and one in the front foyer. Students are encouraged to bring refillable water bottles on a daily basis, but especially during this period of extreme heat. Students should refill their bottles before school, during breaks, at lunch, and/or after school.



## ROC-King Camp – KCSS Grade 9 Students



On Tuesday afternoon Grade 9 students will meet with the mentors to gather information regarding next week's ROC King event.

Students attending ROC King at Camp Wanakita will meet in their cabin groups. Students will meet their mentors and cabin-mates. They will also learn their bus numbers and activity group numbers. Students will be sent home with a pamphlet outlining all necessary information regarding the camp schedule and packing list. Please review this information with your student.

Students attending ROC King at school will meet with their mentors and fellow students. They will be provided with a letter and permission forms for the various activities organized throughout the week. As a reminder, students participating in ROC King at school are expected to be in attendance for the three full school days. Important expectations from the "Creating Pathways to Success" curriculum will be covered.

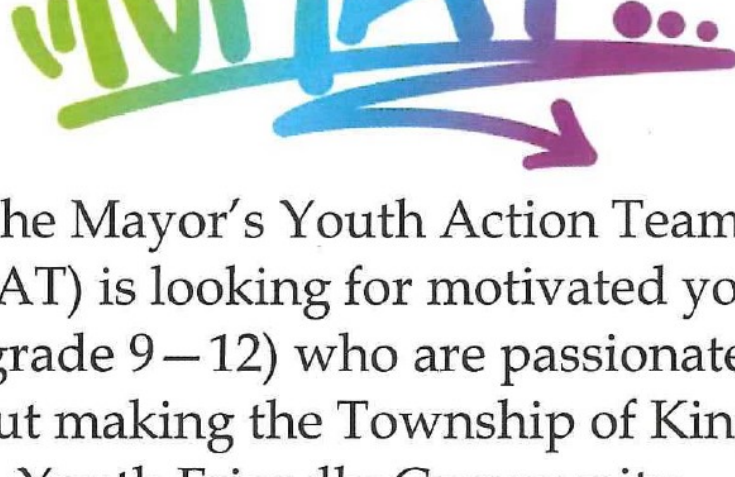

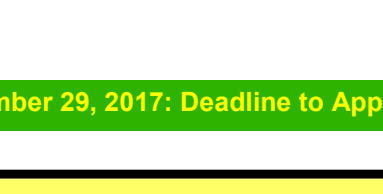
## September 29, 2017: Orange Shirt Day

# Orange Shirt Day

September 29th, 2017



The orange shirt day movement started in 2013 to highlight the pain and suffering of thousands of Indigenous children who were sent to residential school throughout the last century. The colour of the shirt is connected to the experience of Phyllis Webstad who was sent to Cariboo Residential School near Williams Lake, BC, in 1973. Six-years old at the time, Phyllis went to her first day of school wearing a new bright orange shirt. New clothes were a rare thing for the young girl, who was being raised by her grandmother. However, upon arriving at the school, the nuns stripped her of the shirt, forcing her to wear the school's institutional uniform.

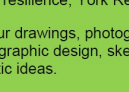


Webstad has felt the impact of that event long after it occurred, "that feeling of worthlessness and insignificance, ingrained in me from my first day at the mission, affected the way I lived my life for many years. Even now, when I know nothing could be further than the truth, I still sometimes feel that I don't matter."

The shirt has since gone on to become a symbol of a national movement that recognizes the suffering of Indigenous children at residential schools across the country and to show a renewed commitment to ensure that every child matters.

Recognize the resiliency and bravery of Residential School Survivors by wearing an orange shirt on September 29th.

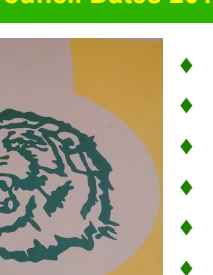

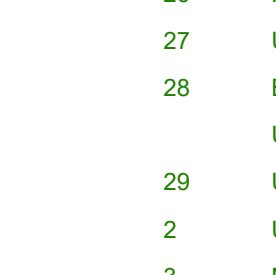
