ESP Team Socks for Souls Drive & Fundraiser



There are so many people that struggle daily to keep themselves and their families safe from domestic violence and homelessness. Homelessness is NOT a choice. There are many reasons why people experience homelessness, including the lack of structural supports for those experiencing poverty, job loss, and inadequate discharge planning for those leaving hospitals, correctional facilities and mental health facilities, as well as those fleeing domestic violence.

The ESP Team has been running two charity events simultaneously: A Homeroom Sock Challenge for Socks 4 Souls, and a Chocolate and Candy Cane Sale for Yellow Brick House (a separate fundraiser from Ms. Covent's class).

The ESP Team is proud to announce that as a community we have collected 429 pairs of socks that will be distributed to a variety of homeless shelters in York Region and Toronto AND we have also raised \$430.90 for Yellow Brick House so that they can continue to help women and children rebuild their lives after escaping domestic violence.

The winner of the Sock 4 Souls Homeroom Challenge that will receive their prize of a delicious pizza lunch, Thursday December 19th, is Ms Fitzpatrick's grade 11 homeroom. Congratulations and thank you for your outstanding donation of 101 pairs of socks. The second winner, also of a pizza lunch, is Mr. Bosse's class who donated the most socks per student, for a total of 84 socks. Honorable mention goes out to our Office Staff who contributed 71 pairs of socks.

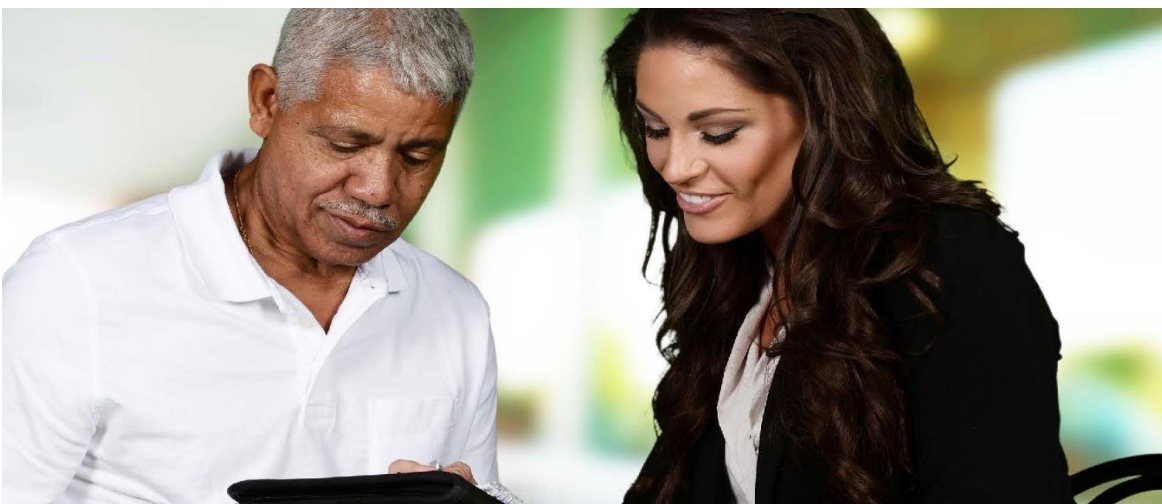
