Course Selection

Course selection materials were distributed to students today in homeroom. Students are required to use <u>my blueprint</u> to select courses, as the YRDSB no longer uses Career Cruising. **Course selection is due on Friday, February 22.** The selections made by students are the basis for the timetable for the 2019-2020 school year, so students should carefully consider which courses they wish to select. Students are encouraged to research possible post-secondary destinations, including prerequisites, and plan their course selection accordingly. It is important to remember that course changes are not always possible after course selection.

After School Literacy Course

Our After School Literacy course in preparation for the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) began yesterday. The course is designed to prepare students for the OSSLT. Students are still encouraged to join the course. Parents and grade 10 students writing the literacy test this year have had results from the OSSLT diagnostic test, that students completed earlier in the year, emailed to them. Parents and students are strongly encouraged to review those results to get a better understanding of how students performed on the diagnostic and skills that may require more practice. Interested students should return forms for the After School Literacy course to Student Success or the Library. A reminder that successful completion of the OSSLT is a requirement for graduation.

Immunization Letters and Clinic

Parents of some grade 11 students have received letters from York Region Public Health about required immunizations. Parents with questions, concerns or proof of immunization should contact public health directly at 1-877-464-9675, ext. 73456.

King City Secondary will be hosting an immunization clinic on February 22nd for our students who received letters. Students can receive their immunizations at that time and public health will be able to update their records on the spot.





Aquatic Leadership Program - Part 2

Be certified as a lifeguard ready for employment



Program Information:

The Aquatic Leadership Program – Part 2 has been extended to include partnerships between the York Region District School Board, Continuing Education and the City of Markham and the City of Vaughan. The program uses a blended learning format consisting of pool instruction, face-to-face instruction in class and on-line learning. Upon completion, successful students may earn the following courses and certifications:

- Secondary School Grade 12 Credit Recreation and Healthy Active Living Leadership PLF4M
- Lifesaving Society National Lifeguard Certification
- Lifesaving Society Swim and Lifesaving Instructor

An examiner from the Lifesaving Society will evaluate the final aquatic skills examinations for the lifeguarding and swim and lifesaving instructor certifications. Students must pass the final exam for each aquatic course including the in-water examinations in order to receive their lifeguarding and swim and lifesaving instructor qualifications. Credits and certifications may be granted independently.

Cost: \$250 includes all course materials and training manuals.





Information on School Bus Cancellation

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be **region-wide** meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries which prevents the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.
