Available Family Supports from Taibu Health Services

Self Awareness and Emotional Resilience For Black Children and Youth

This psychoeducation group will be delivered in two parts. It is designed to help students continue their journey of self-discovery by providing a safe space for them to understand the basics of self-awareness, emotional resilience challenges, and solutions for their age group. It will give them the language to understand the appropriate definitions of race, ethnicity, nationality, sexuality, gender, and pronouns. This discussion will also address in depth triggers such as education, family, societal, relationship, physical and mental health stressors, the unhealthy effects that poor coping habits can have and ultimately provide students with healthy techniques to manage stress. This will assist the students in developing resilience and mental toughness to manage stressors in healthy ways going forward.

Raising Resilient Black Children

This psychoeducation group is designed to help parents/caregivers of Black students develop healthy coping strategies for both their lives and their children's lives as they enter adulthood. Parents/caregivers will have an opportunity to discuss in an open panel their experiences of trauma, understand the definition of it, recognize the signs, and be able to fully discuss the various impacts of racial trauma on their children's lives. Parents/caregivers will learn about the importance of mental wellness, especially in communities of colour like the Black community. There will also be an open panel discussion to address healthy and unhealthy coping mechanisms, identify strategic ways to help students manage unhealthy coping mechanisms and create self-accountability. Parents/caregivers will learn how to become resilient and create self-care plans to support their overall mental and physical wellness and health.
