It is left in the hallways outside her classroom. Consists of healthy snacks along with Canadian Food Guide and healthy information. eg. apples, pears (54lbs of apples in the 1 <sup>st</sup> week), cheese strings (400) and granola bars (350). Still trying to get a hold of the accurate numbers. Asked teachers at staff meeting if they noticed any differences in behaviour. Has been noted by some teachers that for especially the male students they settle down quicker in class. Currently has grants from York Region, Peterborough, had a small fridge donated and a toaster. About 400 programs in the region. Will have to reapply for the grants again for next year. Approximately \$250.00/week for the food. Is using Costco and will be approaching Eat Right to see if she can get better pricing. Program is invitational as much as possible for staff and students. Also a possibility for an industrial fridge to be donated. Have started small and will see how it goes. Guidance also has paper bags to assist in removing stigma as it looks like a home lunch.
