1. Welcome K. Boparai

- The meeting was called to order at 7.01pm

#### 2. Student Council Report

4. EQAO Report M. Faghani

- M. Faghani (Head of Math) highlighted the Grade 9 EQAO results from the 2018-19 school year.
- The results show that on an applied level the school is above both the board and the provincial standard, however, on an academic level the school is below the board but still above the provincial level.
- These positive results stem from a review of data from 2 to 3 years ago. That data showed students had a problem coming in to grade 9 from Elementary school. This led to changes being implemented at the feeder school level with grade 7 and 8 teachers. By working with feeder schools and outlining the grade 9 curriculum positive results can been seen and the gap between grade 8 and 9 is beginning to close.
