- Students will no longer be separated into Academic and Applied streams in Grade 9 courses (please see following slides for more details)

Course Updates - Grade 9 Mathematics



Mathematics, Grade 9, De-streamed Course

The new de-streamed Mathematics, Grade 9 course (MTH1W) was issued in Spring 2021 and is available for educators and parents on the [Curriculum and Resources](#) website. The new course is currently being implemented in classrooms as of September 2021.

Course Updates - Grade 9 Science



NEW Science, Grade 9, De-streamed Course

The new de-streamed Science, Grade 9 course will be issued in Spring 2022 and will be available for educators and parents on the [Curriculum and Resources](#) website. The new course will be implemented in classrooms beginning in September 2022. This course will replace Science, Grade 9, Academic (SNC1D) and Science, Grade 9, Applied (SNC1P).

These courses will be offered using the current **Academic** course with the corresponding course code for the 2022-23 school year. The Applied course for each of these subject areas will expire at the end of the 2021-22 school year.

DE-STREAMING

What is streaming?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Streaming means separating students into different course types such as Academic, Applied and Locally Developed.
What is de-streaming?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> De-streaming means that schools will no longer be offering courses in the Applied Stream.
Why are courses being de-streamed?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Research shows that de-streaming results in better outcomes for students and particularly for those who are from marginalized communities.
How will students with Special Education Needs be supported?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teachers will implement the Individual Education Plan for students who have Special Education needs. Teachers will continue to work collaboratively with Special Education Resource Teachers to support students in Secondary School.

LOCALLY DEVELOPED COURSES

What are Locally Developed (or Essentials) courses?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Locally Developed courses support the needs of students who have been receiving significantly modified programming in Grade 8. Locally Developed courses are offered at the Grade 9 and Grade 10 level in the areas of English, Math, Science and/or History. Locally Developed courses accommodate educational and/or career preparation needs that are not met through other courses. Programs at college and university as well as some apprenticeship programs may not accept courses in this pathway for admission.
Why is my child being recommended for a Locally Developed program?	<p>Students who are recommended to take the Locally Developed course may:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> be working on significantly modified curriculum expectations in Grades 7 & 8. not yet working at grade level and require additional support.
What questions should I ask if my child is	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At what grade level is my child working independently without modifications?
