- ★ Course Selection must be submitted on My Pathway Planner by: Friday, February 23, 2024 @ 4pm

It is a good idea to begin selecting your courses now on My Pathway Planner and submit when course selection opens.

Important Information:

- ★ Your course selection determines which courses run next year
- ★ You will need to <u>submit on time</u> to receive equal consideration for the courses you have selected
- ★ You may not have an opportunity to change your classes, CHOOSE ONCE, CHOOSE WISELY!
- ★ Alternates matter! Please choose wisely!

IDC4O1 - The Brain: The Psychology of Resilience and Motivation

Interested in Health Care? Teaching?, Coaching? Mental health?

Learn about the science of the brain and how it works under stress and pressure. Learn concrete strategies for resilience based on evidence and structural changes in the brain. Focus on the power of Positive Thinking — our brain can be hard-wired to say in the negative — we can retrain our brains! Examining the rational and emotional part of the brain. Cognitive Behavioural Skills — with avoidance our brain doesn't experience that we can handle tough situations.

CLN4U1 - Grade 12 Law

- -This course will explore a range of legal issues and how they are addressed in both Canadian and **International Law** (Note: CLU3M1 focuses on Canadian law)
- -Students will develop an understanding of the principles of Canadian and international law and of issues related to human rights and freedoms, conflict resolution, and criminal, environmental, and workplace law.
- -Students will apply the concepts of legal thinking and will develop legal reasoning skills.

AMG301 - Grade 11 Guitar

Students will learn the basics of playing the guitar - reading notated music, tabs, and developing instrumental technique; they will have the opportunity to create, collaborate and compose. Students will also have the opportunity to perform both in class, and at our end-of-semester concert. Students will develop their understanding of musical conventions such as audience, rehearsal and performance etiquette, and how to effectively practice. Students will also learn new musical terminology and how to apply the elements of music to their compositions and performances; they will also explore the function of music in society with reference to their own life, their community and their culture.



Intermediate Guitar Course will run in 2025-2026!

ASM3O1 - Media Arts

This course focuses on the development of media arts skills through the production of art works involving traditional and emerging technologies, tools, and techniques such as new media, computer animation, digital art work, instillation, interactive sculpture, and web environments. This course provides an additional opportunity for portfolios and an innovative way to create.

- •Six Grade 12 'U' or 'M' courses (most programs require a minimum 75% + admission averages)
- •Consult university web sites, handbooks and "Ontario Universities Info".
- •Universities <u>may</u> consider Gr. 11 ('U' and 'M') courses for admission and/or prerequisites.
- Co-op credits do not count in university admission requirements or admission averages

College Admission Guidelines

- High school diploma with 12 "C" English
- •Additional requirements interview, portfolio, etc.
- "C" &/or "M" type courses used for admission;
- •Math and Science required for most Technology programs
- Applied degree programs have Gr 12 U and M courses as prerequisites
- Consult college handbooks and <u>Ontario Colleges website</u> for specifics (OCAS)


Courses dropped more than <u>5 days</u> after the midterm report will be permanently recorded on your transcript.

Summer School


- Reinforcement 2 weeks for students who did not pass a course, AND are approved by the credit recovery team

In February:


- pick a replacement elective course for the course you would like to take at summer school

My Pathway Planner: Alternate Courses




Please pick 2 alternative courses.
