Forest of Reading

Students from JK/SK to Grade 8 will be able to read many new and exciting book selections from the 2016 Forest of Reading. These books are all written by Canadian authors within the past two years. Students all across Ontario may be reading these books and if eligible, will be able to vote for their winning selection in each division. Students in the Primary Division will have the opportunity to read and evaluate the Blue Spruce collection, Junior Division students read and evaluate the Silver Birch selections and our Intermediate students work on the Red Maple selections. If our students meet the criteria for voting (reading a minimum of 5 books

per category), they will place their votes on-line during our school voting day in April 2016. After the vote, all of these titles will become part of our Library collection of Canadian authors for all to enjoy.

Black History Month

In celebration of Black History Month, classes will be reading and exploring various sources of information to further their understanding of Canadian Black history. Canada is one of the most diverse countries in the world. Many of our people come from different backgrounds – African, Chinese, Scottish, Ukrainian, and First Nations to name a few. We will be touching on the stories of many people and their place in Canadian history.

THE LITERACY LINK

Completing homework on time contributes to school success.

- Homework reinforces skills learned in the classroom and provides additional practice.
- It allows children to be responsible and work independently.
- It maintains a link between home and school by encouraging children to talk about what they are learning, while providing parents with an opportunity to see how their children are progressing.

Four Things You Can Do to Help Your Child with Homework

1. Show that you think education and homework are important.

- Set a regular time and quiet place for completing homework.
- Have homework supplies available.
- Encourage responsibility for completing and returning homework.
- Talk with your child about homework assignments.

2. Monitor your child's work.

- Identify teacher expectations for completing assignments.
- Read and initial your child's agenda nightly. Encourage your child to keep a calendar with due dates of upcoming assignments.
- Check returned assignments for teacher comments.

3. Provide guidance.

- Don't do the assignments yourself! If your child gets stuck, help him/her solve the problem without giving the answer.
- Encourage good study habits. Your child may work more efficiently by using a timer or completing harder assignments first.
- Consider breaking big assignments into more manageable parts. Set realistic time frames for completing each task.

4. Talk with someone at school if a problem comes up.

• Use e-mail, notes, phone calls, or a teacher's website to locate homework information or to contact the teacher.



- Request a conference or call your child's teacher if difficulties arise. Create a plan to solve homework problems.
- Follow up with the teacher to make sure the plan is working.



KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION TO COMMENCE JANUARY 15, 2016

Kindergarten registration will commence on January 15, 2016 for the 2016-17 school year. Registration forms are available on YRDSB's website. Children who turn four or five years old during 2016, live within the school boundary and whose parents are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for kindergarten. A kindergarten information session for parents is being planned for this spring. For more information on registration please visit the YRDSB website or contact the school.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- Birth Verification of student, which may include, but not limited to, birth certificate; statement of birth; birth registration; refugee claimant form; permanent resident card; confirmation of permanent residence (not application for); baptismal certificate; passport; citizenship card; First Nation, Métis, Inuit ancestry; record of landing; substitute registration of birth or adoption; or other Ontario government-sanctioned document approved by the superintendent of schools
- Custody/Adoption documentation if applicable
- Proof of Residency of the student two documents, one from each of the categories below showing the home address;
 - Category A notice of tax assessment, current rental/lease agreement, agreement to purchase including proof of purchase provided before the pupil attends the school, or property tax bill, and
 - o Category B utility bill, bank statement or other official document

Registration begins on Friday, January 15, 2016
