PUNCTULAITY

Punctuality is key in teaching self-discipline. It is important that your child be on the school grounds for soft entry at 8:20 so that they may arrive in class on time and not miss the beginning of lessons or disturb those who were on time. HEALTHY LUNCHES

What's a good approach to building a healthy lunch?

Step one: Think **food groups**. Aim to have at least three of the four food group represented in your child's lunch. Check out Canada's Food Guide to review the food groups.

Step two: Think outside the sandwich! Get creative when choosing items for your child's lunch. Sometimes changing something as simple as the type of grain. For example, using pita, flatbread, tortilla, or cereal instead of bread can make lunch more interesting. You may even want to write up a simple chart to brainstorm different options. Here are some ideas to get you started. Mix and match the options in the different columns to get a variety of lunch meals.

* Foods that need to be kept cold or hot can be packed into a thermos to keep the food at a safe temperature. Cold foods can also be stored with an ice pack or frozen juice box.

Sample lunch #1: Pepper strips with hummus dip, and cheese-filled pasta with tomato sauce.

Sample lunch #2: Marinated cooked tofu in a whole wheat tortilla wrap with shredded lettuce and grated carrot. Add a fruit yogurt on the side.

Sample lunch #3: Why not breakfast for lunch? Hot cereal in a thermos topped with frozen berries and sliced almonds with a cold milk or soy beverage.

What about snacks?

As you plan snacks, think of them as a "mini meal" that includes two of the four food groups. Try these simple nutritious snack ideas:

Whole grain crackers with a cheese stick.

Fresh cut fruit with a yogurt dip

Nut-free trail mix. Combine dried cranberries, raisins, dried apricots, and apple rings with sunflower and pumpkin seeds, along with your kid's favorite cold cereal.

Yogurt tube and small oatmeal muffin

BUSSING ELIGIBILITY

Students' bussing eligibility changes throughout their school career. The provisions for eligibility are available on the YRDSB Transportation Policy:

Grades JK to 3: Students who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

Grades 4 to 8: Students who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

PARKING LOT


We continue to struggle with our parking lot particularly at dismissal time. We are asking all parents/ guardians to make every attempt to park close by and walk to school to pick up your child/children. We have many parents/guardians parked, blocking the drive through lane. We respectfully ask that you **DO NOT BLOCK/PARK IN THE DRIVE THROUGH LANE.** If you need to park your car to enter the school or wait for your child/children please use any available spaces along the curb, any empty parking spaces or utilize curb parking along Islington Avenue in front of the school. If not available, we ask that you follow these guidelines:

- Park on the street or somewhere close and walk to our yard to meet your child/children at their respective door or designated spot (parking is now also available along Islington Avenue in front of the school)
- Continue moving through the drive through lane, not stopping and waiting and travel out of the parking lot and re enter when a spot becomes available.

Under no circumstances are drivers permitted to leave their vehicles if they are not parked along the curb.

Drivers may park all along the perimeter of our parking lot taking careful note to not block the entrance or exit of the parking lot or permitted to stop their vehicle in the drive-through lane to let students exit the vehicle as this is extremely dangerous as drivers are not expecting students to run out from this lane.

Please share this information with any guardian, grandparent or relative that drops off/picks up at the school. We as a community need to help this situation. For student safety if the situation does not improve during the busy pick up time, we will be controlling all vehicle entry to the parking lot between 2:30 and 3:05 by closing the parking lot and not allowing any cars to enter/exit (if already parked). Please help us by following the drop off and pick up guidelines. Please also see the map below to help with any questions you may have.

Following is an overview of the major initiatives/events that School Council is a part of each year:
