Dear Parents,

Every year during the first week of May, we recognize Mental Health Awareness Week. This year, along with fantastic community partners, we are hosting several school wide events to support our ongoing learning, and the sense of inclusion and belonging at LSPS.

On the evening of **May 1st**, from **6:30-8:00 pm**, we welcome all families to join us for our '**Family Wellness Night**'. Our evening will begin with a keynote address from Michelle Cassidy, the YRDSB Mental Health and Wellness Lead. Michelle's engaging and entertaining speaking style provides parents with great ideas for supporting their children. Following the keynote address, families can enjoy several stations with make-and-take activities (e.g. baking, crafts, technology, yoga). We hope to see everyone out for a great evening!

During the school day on **May 11th**, our grade four through eight students are spearheading '**The Ring of Peace at Lake Simcoe**'. This call is a safety check; in accordance with the YRDSB Safe Arrival Policy #665.

Kiss N' Ride Reminder

When dropping off and picking up students at school, we appreciate community cooperation to keep our Kiss N' Ride running SAFELY and SMOOTHLY. The Kiss N' Ride is an officially recognized Fire Route – as such, the driver <u>cannot exit/park</u> their car in this area.

*Please wait in line for an available spot along the sidewalk *Ensure your child is prepared to exit on the **sidewalk** side of your car for safety

- *<u>**DO NOT**</u> double park children are in danger if they cross between parked cars
- *Our Kiss N' Ride volunteers will walk kindergarten children to the gates

If you are planning to walk your children to their gate or line-up, kindly park your car in an available parking spot.





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ALL parents and visitors **MUST report** to the office upon their arrival to the school, to sign in, and obtain a visitors badge.

We ask that all parents wait outside for their children, and if you need to speak to your child's teacher, please send a note or call their voicemail/office to request an appointment.

One Bowl Spiced Gingerbread Muffin

Author: Fork Knife Swoon Prep Time: 20 mins Cook Time: 20 mins Total Time: 40 mins Yield: 12 Muffins

1/2 cup (1 small/medium) very ripe banana, mashed 1 large egg

1 tsp pure vanilla extract

zest of half an orange (optional)

1-1/2 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp ground ginger

1/2 tsp ground cloves

1/4 tsp ground nutmeg

1/2 tsp fine-grain sea salt

1/2 cup canola or vegetable oil

1/3 cup molasses

1/3 cup unsweetened almond milk (or sub 2% dairy milk)

1/3 cup granulated sugar

1/3 cup dark brown sugar

1 tsp baking powder

1/2 tsp baking soda

2-1/4 cups all-purpose flour

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F. Line a 12-cup muffin pan with paper liners or lightly grease with butter or non-stick cooking spray. Set aside.

In a large mixing bowl, use the back of a fork to mash the banana together with the egg until completely combined and only small lumps remain. Use a spatula to stir in the vanilla, orange zest, spices and salt.Add the oil, molasses and milk, stirring until completely combined between each addition. Add the sugars and stir to combine. Add the baking powder and baking soda and stir to combine. Fold in the flour until just mixed. Do not overbeat.Use a cookie scoop to divide the batter evenly between the muffin cups, about 3/4 full. Bake for 10 minutes at 400 degrees F. Turn the oven temperature down to 375 degrees F., turn the muffin pan around, and bake for an additional 7-9 minutes until the muffin tops are set and a cake tester inserted into the center of the muffins comes out clean. Let cool in the muffin tins for 5 minutes, then transfer to a baking rack to cool completely. Serve warm or at room-temperature.

The ClearWater Farm Water Walk – Saturday, June 23rd, 2018

Start: Willow Beach Park with a 1 km walk along Lake Drive to ClearWater Farm

It's a FREE, fun, family-friendly learning event for the whole community!

Led by Chippewas water keepers, participants will walk along the shores of Lake Simcoe to ClearWater Farm where they will visit interactive, hands-on learning stations themed around Water, Earth, Food and Community.

ClearWater Farm, Georgina's newest community asset is a place for experiential learning connecting nature, food, community and eco-friendly technology and has enormous potential to make a difference for kids. This event will be an exciting opportunity to extend your students' environmental sustainability classroom learning by building on both Earth Day and National Aboriginal Day.

EARTH DAY LEARNING:

The walk will include a visit to ClearWater's market gardens and greenhouses where kids can dig in the dirt to plant tomatoes, learn about how much water they will require, and discover how farms can help Lake Simcoe.

NATIONAL ABORIGINAL DAY

LEARNING: After a traditional water blessing, participants will be led along the lake by a group of First Nations women, the traditional 'keepers of water'. At the farm, a FN smudging ceremony will welcome everyone as they find out more about Traditional Knowledge about water.

But there's still more...This event is also helping rebuild the ClearWater Farm barn that burned down accidentally in 2016. From tragedy can come hope -- and businesses will be sponsoring this Water Walk to help the barn raising this summer to create an amazing interactive education space for children.

Class Placement for 2017-2018

Much of the planning for a new school year begins NOW! We will be discussing organizational structures, special education delivery models, teaching assignments and timetabling very soon.

One of the most important tasks that usually begin in May is the placement of students into new classes for September. Homeroom teachers in consultation with receiving teachers, appropriate support staff and school administration devote much discussion time to the generation of classes that strive to best meet the needs of all of our students. Class placement is a complex process that takes many hours of thought and discussion. Decisions are made following careful consideration of a number of criteria: balance of student abilities, interests and talents, gender balance, class size (consistent with Board and Ministry guidelines), learning style, learning partners and social factors. While friendship issues can play a role in the comfort level of some students, at particular developmental stages, some friends learn best in separate classes.

Often parents have new and/or important information to share about their child which lends assistance to class placement decisions. Recent medical diagnoses, significant negative peer relationships that exist outside the school's awareness or significant individual/family issues that may impact learning, are items of information which are appreciated prior to the placement process.

Parent input that is received in writing by the office prior to May 7, 2018 will be considered (and shared with teachers) during placement meetings. Please avoid naming a teacher since staffing can vary due to enrolment fluctuations, teacher leave of absences, teacher requests for different assignments, teacher transfers and surplus. Input after May 7, 2018 may not be considered due to the complexity of the task. Please be advised that while such input is valued, it cannot drive class placement decisions since school-wide limitations and a variety of other factors will, at times, take precedence. Final decisions regarding student placements remain the responsibility of the principal. Class placement information will be shared on opening day in September. Thank you for partnering with us in this very important task.
