EQAO

Each year, students in grades 3 and 6 undergo a set of Ministry of Education assessments in reading, writing and mathematics. During the month of May and June, students in grade 3 and 6 will participate in province wide EQAO testing. These assessments provide beneficial information for the government, teachers, students and parents on the achievement levels of students in Ontario. They also provide valuable information for improving student learning and can enhance instructional planning.

It is very important that all students in these grades are available to write the tests. This year, EQAO testing for both grade 3 and 6 will run between May 23 and June I. We ask that you do not schedule appointments for your child during this time so we can minimize disruptions and distractions as well as avoid any makeup session for students. Absent students are recorded in our scores and can greatly skew the results.

Dress Code

During the warm weather months, children are to come to school dressed modestly yet comfortably, in a clean and appropriate manner respectful of self and others. Clothing must be appropriate for a school environment. No bare midriff, no visible undergarments, no short shorts (arm's length including fingertips is a good measure), no revealing tops, no spaghetti straps or low cut tank tops. Straps should be 3 fingers wide.

Flip flops do not adequately protect feet, and are not recommended footwear for school. Hats/bandanas are not allowed to be worn inside the school.

Clothing printed with inappropriate words/slogans or pictures are not allowed.

Bus Eligibility

In accordance with Board Policies, transportation is provided for students who live within their Home School attendance area and outside their grade appropriate Non-Transportation Zone. As indicated below, transportation eligibility will change throughout a student's school career:

All YCDSB and YRDSB students in grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are **not eligible** for transportation.

All YCDSB and YRDSB students in grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are **not eligible** for transportation.

All YCDSB students in grades 9-12 who live within 4.8 km of their school in a transit served area are **not eligible** for transportation.

Parents of students entering grade four are encouraged to determine their child's transportation eligibility and to make the necessary arrangements should their child no longer qualify for transportation.

Health and Safety Monthly Message The Bugs of Summer

Working in the great outdoors can mean being exposed to biting insects such as ticks and mosquitoes.

Hazards associated with mosquitoes and ticks:

- West Nile Virus: can cause serious illness in humans. It can be passed to humans through a bite from an infected mosquito.
- Lyme Disease: an illness caused by a bacteria that is spread through the bite of a black legged tick (deer tick).
- West Nile and Lyme are not spread from human to human contact.
- Although the risk of contracting a vector-borne disease (such as lyme or west nile), is low, self protection is the best way to stay safe outdoors, see Reduce the Risk below for safety tips.

Reduce the Risk

Follow these safety tips when outdoors

- Clean up standing water where mosquitoes like to breed. See YRDSB, Q&As regarding West Nile Virus for information.
- Wear insect repellant when working outdoors, ones containing DEET are effective against mosquitoes and ticks.
- Wear pants and long sleeve shirts when working outdoors. Check clothing for ticks and brush any off before going back inside. Do not crush ticks with your fingers.
- Choose closed footwear and tuck your pants into your socks.
- Search your body for ticks, especially the groin, scalp, back and underarm areas.
- Remove attached ticks from your body as soon as possible and keep for identification. Instructions to do this safely and where to submit for identification are available at York.ca/lymedisease

The Regional Municipality of York monitors West Nile and Lyme disease activity. Updates on monitoring activity is posted on York Region Health Services website.

York Region Public Health Immunization Information

In the 2017/18 school year, York Region Public Health will visit all elementary schools to provide school immunization clinics to Grade 7 students. The clinics offer vaccines for Hepatitis B, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) and Meningococcal A, C, Y, W-135 at no cost.

Lake Wilcox Public School

Under the Immunization of School Pupils Act, meningococcal vaccine is required for school attendance, unless an exemption is filed with public health. Hepatitis B and HPV vaccines are recommended, but not required for school attendance.

Parents of students entering Grade 7

in fall 2017 will receive consent forms in the mail in June. Please complete the consent form and return it to York Region Public Health to allow your child to participate in the immunization clinics. Detailed instructions can be found on the forms and accompanying letter. If the consent form is not completed, your child will not be able to receive vaccines at the clinic.

Parents and guardians who do not consent should still complete the forms and return them, indicating that you do not authorize York Region Public Health to immunize your child.

Visit <u>york.ca/immunizations</u> and click on School Immunization Clinics for more information.

Did you know? If your child has missed a required vaccination on Ontario's routine immunization schedule, he/she can receive the vaccine at one of York Region Public Health's Community Immunization Clinics. These evening clinics are offered throughout the summer, giving students the opportunity to catch up before returning to school. Visit york.ca/immunizations and select Community Immunization Clinics to learn more.

"Three Wishes" Bracelets Fundraiser


