- Subcommittee 1 update: (by Julie) In addition to existing initiatives like LAMPS, School Council may want to introduce an event for families to connect and engage:

 - 25th anniversary celebration
 - Spiritwear (25th anniversary logo are being redesigned by school staff)
 - Appreciation breakfast will be planned for a PA day in January

- Subcommittee 2 update (by Olga & Chuan)
 - Considering a speaker to discuss "failing forward"
 - Considering an "I'm a genius at..." workshop and possibility to turn resulted student art into a 25th anniversary mural
 - Considering incorporating more cultural foods into hot lunches
 - Considering uplifting "look for the light" song suggestions for music class
- Subcommittee 3 update by Ms. Welburn: The School Improvement Goals remain the same. We are working on revising the action plan and monitoring.

Here are the three goals:

1. Foster Health and Well-Being If educators build strong relationships with students, then they will be better equipped to identify and address the diverse needs of students, ultimately supporting their health and wellbeing.

2. Student Achievement

If we provide instruction focused on personalised learning goals and assessments that are flexible, relevant, and authentic, then we will establish a culture of high expectations.

3. Inclusive Education

If we prioritize the intentional creation of identity-affirming spaces and practices that are inclusive of all communities, free of racism and hate, then we can create an anti-oppressive environment where all students feel valued and understood.

School has also looked into <u>brainable.ca</u> presentation as a learning opportunity for kids. They are fully booked for the remainder of the year, but the school will look into booking for next year.



Percentage of fully participating students at or above the provincial standard (Levels 3 and 4) for the 2023–2024 school year: 61%




EQAO Results - Primary - Writing


