## Lake Wilcox PS - School Improvement Plan Goals \& Objectives

## 1. Foster Well-Being \& Mental Health

Build relationships to identify the diverse needs of students in order to support the mental health and well-being of students.

- We are anti-racist educators; classrooms are safe spaces where students can be their authentic selves
- MLL students have opportunities to use their native language in classwork, as needed, in order to further their learning
- MLL students see themselves and their culture reflected in classroom learning resources.

Liaison with broader community support. <br> What specific trends have you observed in the past year compared to years prior? <br> - Impacts after virtual learning and the impacts of the pandemic. <br> - Unique needs at each school. <br> - Mental health - broad range - anxiety to depression to bullying to grief. General trends. Not unique to post pandemic, but perhaps augmented due to the affects of covid and being in-person <br> What are you seeing at LWPS that is different from other schools? <br> - Not specific to LWPS - every student need is different... (not our school) has a student with a lot of grief and loss due to death of a family member - just so happens that at this school they're experiencing other cases of grief this year. <br> Are there areas that we could support/promote/educate/focus on for the school without breeching trust or crossing lines? <br> - Something that has come up - at the schools - bullying and students not being nice. Peer conflict. Cyber bullying. Students not being nice during recess. Has been supporting students through this.
