#### 5. **Grade 8 Graduation**

#### 7. Community Communication and Engagement

Some parents have created WhatsApp groups to connect with one another; this could be a way for Council to inform them of initiatives. Council brainstormed ideas for fostering communication with

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	parents outside of formal channels, including using Whatsapp chat groups. Ultimately Council is an official school organization, and communication between council and parents needs to follow formal channels.  Recommend future brainstorming innovative ways to communicate with LWPS families and formalize how the parent community can submit ideas and feedback for Council to review. This includes methods Council can use to inform and engage the parents and greater community.

Andrea is looking into adding Kids Kitchen for Mondays.

	The School Council section of the website needs to be updated with current year information. Nikki will work with Andrea to update.			
11.	Parking Lot Safety			
	Morning drop offs in parking lot is dangerous and treacherous. In the past there were staff who would help direct traffic but staff is not permitted to do this. Council could consider organizing volunteers for traffic control.
