# LANGSTAFF SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS & SERVICES

#### **Programs:**

- We have 4 Community Classes (2 Autism, 2 Complex Needs)
- We have SERTS- to support students with an IEP in class, and in our Resource Room
- We teach 4 levels of the Learning Strategies course (Grades 9-12)
- GLE101, GLE201, GLE301, GLE401

Students in our department are supported through an IPRC and/or an IEP

 In February: Spec Ed Dept Head meets with the Principal and SERT at the Elementary Schools for the Gr 8-9 transition IPRC. At this meeting we discuss recommended program and placement for each student with an IEP.

## THE IEP: LEVELS OF SUPPORT

- Indirect Service- Monitoring of marks, and progress through appointments with SERT only is very rare circumstances will a student be signed up for this level of service
- Resource Assistance- Monitoring of marks, and progress through regular appointments with SERT, academic support offered either in class or in Resource Room. This is the for the majority of our students.
- Withdrawal Assistance-Monitoring of marks, and progress through regular appointments with SERT, academic support offered either in class or in Resource Room, PLUS the addition of a GLE (Learning Strategies) course in the students timetable.
- Partially-Integrated Community Class placements (Autism/Complex Needs)

# ROLE OF A SERT Special Education Resource Teacher

- IEP Consultation Form sent home for input and review
- Write and share the IEPs with teachers
- Advocate for student needs
- Make referrals as needed
- Monitor each student's progress
- Communicate regularly with parents of students with an IEP
- Resource Support (in class, and in our Resource Room)
- Teach the Learning Strategies Courses (GLE101, 201, 301, 401)
- Attend In-School Team Meetings
- Academic Assessments for those who have not already been identified.
   Note: we do not do re-assessments
- Facilitate the SEA (Laptop) transfer from Elementary to Secondary

### LEARNING STRATEGIES COURSE

GLE101, 201, 301, 401

This is a course that students with an IPRC can select when making course selections. It is a credit course, and meets the requirement of a group 1 credit for graduation, and is scheduled into students timetable.

- **GLE101** Students will learn about executive functioning skills (organization, time management, memory and coping skills, and planning)
- We will continue to work with them on building initiative, responsibility, independent work habits, collaboration skills, and self regulation.
- **GLE201** more work is done on learning skills, with an focus on literacy skills in preparation for the OSSLT.
- **GLE301** Exploration of opportunities and pathways, with a focus on making appropriate course selection

**GLE401**- Transitions and change, with a focus on post secondary application processes and building advocacy skills

### COMMUNITY CLASSES

#### Autism 139

- This program has a class maximum of 6 students
- Not credit bearing
- Focus on individual needs and personal life skills

#### Autism140

- This program has a maximum of 6 students
- Focus is a combination of personal life skills as well as academic credit attainment. Students have the opportunity to integrate into credit courses throughout the year.
- Some students may toward a Ontario Secondary School Certificate.

#### <u>Complex Needs</u> (we have 2 programs)

- Class maximum of 3 students
- Not credit bearing
- Focus on individual needs and personal life skills

### THE RESOURCE ROOM

Room 134 is dedicated for all students who have an IEP

- The room is always supervised by an EA who can support students with both academic and social-emotional needs
- and SERTs will use this space as well, to meet with students, provide extra help and assist students with school work

#### STUDENT SUCCESS ROOM- BEAR'S DEN

#### Our Student Success Room is located in Room 132

- Our Student Success Teacher is involved in students' transitions to Secondary School by attending preliminary meetings in the spring to create Student Learner Profiles which are shared with Guidance and Special Education. We then work as a team to support ALL students, and make referrals as needed to Social Work or the Special Education Department.
- Room 128 is a warm and welcoming place for students to receive support and catch up on work. Teachers can connect with staff ahead of time to arrange support or students can request to do some drop in work here as needed.
- the Student Success Centre is staffed with a Teacher and CYW who are available for both academic and social-emotional support, all periods of the day (including lunch).



### What do you need to graduate from high school?

#### 30 Credits: 18 Compulsory Credits and 12 Optional Credits

#### Compulsory credits are comprised of the following:

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)\*
- 3 credits in Mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian History
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography
- 1 credit in The Arts
- 1 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a Second Language
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics

#### In addition, students must complete:

- 12 optional credits†
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- the provincial literacy requirement
- earn at least two credits through Online Learning \*\*\*\*

#### Plus ONE compulsory credit from each of the following groups:

#### Group 1

- English (including the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course)
- French as a Second Language, Classical Languages, International Languages
- · Indigenous Languages
- · Canadian and World Studies
- · First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Studies
- · Social Sciences and Humanities
- · Guidance and Career Education
- Cooperative Education\*\*\*

- \* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a Second Language (ESL) or English Literacy Development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.
- \*\* In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a Second Language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.
- \*\*\* A maximum of 2 credits in Cooperative Education can count as compulsory credits.
- \*\*\*\* Families who wish to opt out their child from the Online Learning graduation requirement should speak to their child's school.
- † The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved Dual Credit courses.
- ^ Student's achieving an OSSD Red Seal Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) diploma will have additional requirements based on their particular program.

# ONLINE LEARNING GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

- Students that entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year
- Must earn at least two online learning credits to get their
   Ontario Secondary School Diploma
- Also applies to adult learners that will be entering the Ontario secondary school system starting in 2023-24 school year.

# ONLINE LEARNING GRADUATION REQUIREMENT


#### Opting out

- Parents may wish to opt out or exempt their child from the online graduation requirement
- Must complete the opt-out form available from their child's school board.
- Exemption from the online learning graduation requirements may be requested by:
  - the parent or guardian of the secondary student
  - students who are 18 years of age or older
  - students who are 16 or 17 years of age and have withdrawn from parental control
