The cost is \$35 for students who have their school activities fees paid for the 2024-2025 school year and \$40 if it has not been paid yet.



Information about YRDSB Summer School 2025

Hello Parents and Guardians of our Langstaff Students;

Summer School is being offered by our school board during the month of July.

Types of Summer School Opportunities

<u>Acceleration Courses:</u> These are 18 day courses for students who have completed a course but feel that they need to upgrade their mark and their understanding of the course for future studies.

<u>Online Learning</u>: This format is available mainly for grade 11 and grade 12 courses. Online learning does not require the students and teacher to be face-to-face and therefore, the specific timing online is flexible. However students must be prepared to be online for a minimum of 6 hours daily. Access to a desktop or laptop with high speed Internet is required. Students also must be residing in Ontario for the session.

Dates: Wednesday, July 2nd to Friday, July 25th

In-Person Learning: Students are required to be in class for the duration of the course. They also must be able to get to the school offering the course and be in the classroom by 8:45 a.m. each morning. The classes end at 3:33 pm. Grade 10, 11 and 12 courses are available.

Dates: Wednesday, July 2nd to Friday, July 25th, 8:45 am - 3:33 pm

Registration will open for students on Tuesday, April 15th. They apply using their **My Pathway Planner** (MyBlueprint) student account. They will choose the "**Continuing Education**" icon and then choose their preferred school location and course. Please note that for students choosing to take Civics and Career Studies, they will need to complete the steps for both Civics and then Career Studies.

Students MUST print out a Verification Form that MUST be signed by their parent/guardian and then returned to the Guidance Department at Langstaff for approval ASAP as spots fill up quickly.
