A Message from your Administrators

Hello Langstaff Families and Community Members,

We hope that this e-bulletin finds you and your family members well. So hard to believe that May is just about upon us. Once May arrives things at school really, get busy - as if we were not already a busy, bustling place.

Over the past two days, many of our students were writing the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test. We are very proud of our students who have prepared for and written this graduation requirement. We will not know results of this EQAO assessment for a number of weeks and we will share information as soon as we get it.

Our BSA (Black Student Association) held a very successful "Braid Bar" event this week. Our students loved getting their hair braided and it was so nice to see so many students come out and participate in this wonderful event.

Today all mid-term marks were due into the main office and all mid-term report cards will be sent home between April 25 and April 29.
