A Message from your Administrators from November 10

Dear Langstaff Families and Community Members:

We have just about reached the halfway point of the first semester. It is truly remarkable how many incredible things go on in this school. It is nice to see both the staff and the students engaged in teaching and learning each and every day.

November is a time of reflection and remembrance. This week, we have observed both Holocaust Education Week and Remembrance Day. For Holocaust Education Week we did a number of things. Our Learning Commons hosted the moving exhibit "Not in My Name", the story of the ship the St. Louis. Twenty-five of our classes have visited this display over the week. We also had the Tour for Humanity Bus on our properties for two days. Approximately 200 students were able to attend an in-school field trip on the bus to learn about the Holocaust and begin the conversation on why such atrocities were able to take place. Our students learned the stages to genocide, talked about where else in our History, both past and present, genocide, and occurred. This was a very impactful experience for our students. Special thanks to Ms. Romero for organizing these Holocaust Education events.

For Remembrance Day, all LSS students attended a Remembrance Day Assembly today to recognize the importance of November 11 in Canada's History. Students from history, art, drama and our Music Club have worked very hard to put this wonderful assembly together for the school community. We also had all our students contribute a message of "remembering" to our large LSS Remembrance Day wreath. It was clear that our students found the variety and content of information shared with the students was meaningful and relevant to their lives and their learning.
