Credit Rescue/Catch up Day

Langstaff will be having three Credit Rescue/Credit Catch Up Days this school year. One will be this semester one Tuesday December 12, and two will be second semester on April 3rd and June 5th. These days are for students to review any concepts that they don't understand in the class, work on upcoming assignments, study for upcoming tests, complete outstanding assignments and tests, and get feedback from teachers on the course work. Some students that have outstanding assignments or tests may work with the students success team in the library that day to help them get caught up. Our student success team consists of a variety of teachers and staff from different subject areas that will be able to support students in getting caught up with their courses. If you have any questions or concerns about that day, please let me know.

Langstaff offers a huge CONGRATS to our Boys' Varsity Volleyball team, who made it to the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Association (OFSAA) this year! Our Langstaff team had an incredible regular season, ending with a 20-3 record.

In playoff action, the team lost a nail-biter to Aurora, sending them to face *École secondaire catholique Renaissance* for an OFSAA spot. In a packed gym full of cheering Renaissance fans, the team confronted its adversaries and came out victorious in 3-1 sets! Like birds taking flight and soaring to our destiny, we became the YRAA "Single A" champs!

Next was the OFSAA tournament—the top prize in the province—hosted at Rockway Mennonite Collegiate in Kitchener. The team faced a number of tough opponents from across the province. Langstaff was placed in the "Group of Death" with Rockway and Hamilton Christian Academy, both of whom are previous OFSAA champions. The Bears took third place in the group, sending them to the Consolation round.

It was nothing but victory after victory from there on out. Your Langstaff team handily made it to the quarter finals, then the semi-finals, and ultimately the final round in Consolation play. The result? Another VICTORY, of course!

Your Langstaff team brought home the banner and the plaque for winning the OFSAA Single-A Consolation Championship! What an incredible season—and one that will go down in Langstaff history.


