ATTENDANCE REPORT

There is a positive relationship between regular attendance and success in school. Students at LSS are required to attend regularly, to be punctual, and to participate in all scheduled classes.

VALID ABSENCES include illness, bereavement or family emergency.

AUTHORIZED ABSENCES include dentist/doctor appointments, driver's test, and court appearances.

EXCUSED ABSENCES refer to field trips and school sanctioned events. Students are still considered to be at school.

EXTENDED ABSENCES of four days or more require the completion of a "Special Leave" form at least one week in advance of the leave. This form may be obtained from the Main Office. A parent/guardian signature is required. It is the student's responsibility to catch up on all work missed.

DO NOT plan absences or family vacations during culminating and exam periods as the evaluations CANNOT be rescheduled.

Absent for a Full Day	Phone the school with a valid reason the same day or send a note upon return
Absent for One or More Classes	Phone with valid reason indicating the time of absence or send a note with the student
Leaving Before the End of the Day	Student signs out in attendance office with a note from the parent/guardian
In the Event of an Emergency	Contact the office as soon as possible.

For safety reasons, students who have signed out must leave the building as they will not be directly supervised.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS TURNING 18

Under the Education Act, parents/guardians have a right to access their child's Ontario Student Record if the child is under 18.

If the student is 18 or over, the Board/school must follow the privacy provisions of the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act regarding the disclosure of personal information about the student to their parents/guardians.

Students 18 or over must provide written permission by signing the <u>Consent for Information Sharing</u> form to allow parents/guardians to continue to access school-related information about the student. This includes academic progress, attendance and behaviour.

Students can also obtain the form from the school office.

PREPARING FOR THE EQAO

Dear Parent or Guardian,

Your child will be writing the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) on **April 10**th **2018**. Additional information about the actual day will be sent to you at a later date. As part of our effort to ensure that your child is prepared and confident for the OSSLT, we have prepared this practice booklet which will be used over the month of March, in your child's regular classes. We hope to be able to familiarize students with strategies to be successful for the test, as well as provide them with some experience with the types of questions they will encounter on the test.

FROM THE MODERNS DEPARTMENT

As it has become a tradition at Langstaff, some students from the French and Moderns Department had been preparing for so long for the annual French Language oral contest known as "Concours d'art oratoire" that is taking place on Thursday, March 22nd, from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at Tommy Douglas Secondary school. This oral spoken contest gives the opportunity to our students, both from the French Immersion program and the Core French Program, to speak in front of an audience about a topic that they like without notes, to affirm their capabilities of fluency in the language and educate on an interesting aspect of life or culture at the same time, tout en français. This truly important contest is a very good chance for the students who love the language and who would like to carry it outside the classroom, in a very formal context, to meet with other students from across the board and to measure their skills to others, so as to have a good sense of their level and make new friends through French Language.

Langstaff students have the reputation to perform very well at this contest, and we sincerely hope that they will rank themselves among the very best of the York Region District School Board. We have students competing in the two categories offered for all Grade Levels, which are: Prepared Speech and Impromptu Speech. The Prepared Speech, which is the traditional one, allows students to select and prepare in advance their speech that they are going to deliver on the day of the contest, whereas the Impromptu Speech gives the opportunity to the contestants to prepare on the spot, about a topic that they will be given by the judges a few minute before their performance. I both cases, the contestants have to go in depth in their topic and show that they can wrap their heads around it and come up with an impressive fluent speech, just like native speakers.


