A Message from your Administrators

Dear Langstaff Families and Community Members,

I hope that you and your family have enjoyed a wonderful March Break and are looking forward to the final few months of the semester.

I want to tell you about some wonderful student-driven activities that have taken place this week at LSS. Our Persian Club set up a "Haft Sin" display in honour of Nowruz, the Persian New Year. This "Haft Sin" display contains the seven essential symbols – Wheat Grass, Dried Fruit, Vinegar, Apple, Sumac, Sweet Pudding, and Garlic – that represent nature. The LSS students have thoroughly enjoyed walking past this very decorative display to learn more about Persian culture and traditions.

We have also set up a Multi-Faith space for those students who wish to pray during Ramadan. The prayer room is located in the library. Students are free to access this space when they need to throughout Ramadan or any time of the school year.

Indicate First Nation, Métis, and Inuit ancestry on the school registration form. School administrators are available to support you. Please contact your school office if you have any questions.
