Classes occur online using an asynchronous model, with check-in opportunities with the teacher. The learning platform is Brightspace by D2L.

1 Credit Co-op

1 Credit Co-op is available to students in Grades 10 - 12 interested in a work experience.

Students will participate in virtual and in-person learning

with their Co-op teacher and in-person/virtual Co-op placements in their community during the month of July. In person classes will take place at Dr.

Bette Stephenson Centre for Learning at 36 Regatta Avenue in Richmond Hill. Due to limited enrollment, students entering Grade 12 who could not

schedule Co-op into their regular timetable will be given priority.

use a variety of design thinking techniques to develop and grow their ideas. They will consider the ethical and legal implications of decisions, the




