

A Message from your Administrators

Dear Langstaff Families and Community Members:

Although the leaves are beginning to turn we are still enjoying summer weather – and next week is looking like we are having a full return to warm weather! It will be a wonderful way to start the month of October.

We are very excited that fall sports have begun and students have the opportunity to participate and get involved in their school community. Try outs for the sports teams are announced over the morning announcements. Our Cross Country Running Team and Boys Soccer are off to a great start. We also had our Clubs Fair a couple of weeks ago and many clubs are up and running. Our Red Cross Society Club successfully raised close to \$400 that will be donated the earthquake relief effort in Morocco. We are very proud of the work our Red Cross Society Club undertakes.

This week is YRDSB's Safety Week. During this week (and into next week) we have held or will be holding a practice Fire Drill, Lock Down Drill, Hold & Secure Drill, and Bomb Threat Drill. As well, all our students a Safe School's Assembly led by LSS administration.

GAPPS profile pictures

Each year, students have the opportunity to change their GAPPS profile picture.

On October 3 in all period 1 classes will watch a video reminding them of the guidelines.

Between October 10-13th students can switch their profile picture following the guidelines.

These guidelines give students and educators four options when selecting GAPPS profile pictures:

- Photo of Self (students and educators may wish to add their name and/or preferred pronouns to the photo)
- Drawing or Silhouette of Self (students and educators may wish to add their name and/or preferred pronouns to the drawing)
- Given/Preferred Name or Phonetic illustration of given/preferred name (students and educators may wish to add their preferred pronouns to the illustration)
- The initial of the first name (GAPPS default image; no modifications possible; no action required)

Dear parents/guardians,

As part of a partnership between YRDSB and Renewed Computer Technology (RCT), families with children enrolled in our Board have the opportunity to purchase quality refurbished computers at a reduced cost. Applicants must live in Ontario, have a student enrolled at YRDSB and either receive government assistance payments or qualify as a limited income earner under the limited income cut-off standards*.

Below is a limited income grid for your reference.

This year, there are different packages available for purchase. Please reference the [online application page](#) for the current available package offerings. Please note that there are three options for delivery.

1. If you would like for the computer to be delivered directly to your home, there is a \$40 charge for laptops and a \$50 charge for desktops. Families who choose this delivery option will have their order shipped when it is ready, roughly 3 weeks from date of order.
 2. If you would like the device shipped to your child's school there is a \$20 delivery charge. If you choose this shipping option, the computer will be delivered to your child's school **after** the end of the promotion period. Please indicate the name of the school on the form when selecting this option.

3. You may choose to pick up the computer from the RCT Mississauga Warehouse, for free, located at **945 Meyerside Drive, Mississauga**. Families who choose this option will have their order ready for pick up roughly 3 weeks after the date of order.

Parents and legal guardians may apply for one computer per student, with a limit of two per household. Please see below for a full list of device specifications.

If you are interested in applying, please complete an online application at <https://www.jotform.com/210054491659255> using the group code on the attached program flyer. The application period is from September 21, 2023 – November 23, 2023 with delivery to schools taking place in December.
