York Region District School Board Student Surveys

In order to provide information for Board and School planning, York Region District School Board students in Grades 5 to 12 will be invited to participate in a school survey. The survey, which is anonymous and confidential, will be conducted from **April 7 to May 15, 2015** and will take place at school. The information from this survey will be used to identify areas to be addressed, monitor progress and plan strategies to support student achievement and well-being. Aligned with Board priorities, the survey will address topics including equity and inclusion, school safety, learning environment, student well-being and other priorities. York Region District School Board School Climate Survey for Parents Key Findings

In May and June 2014, parents were invited to complete a questionnaire to collect perception data about their child's school environment and learning. The survey addressed topics including equity and inclusion, school safety, learning environment, student well-being and parent engagement. More than 14,000 parents participated in the survey.

Overall, parents tended to have positive perceptions of school safety, the learning environment at their child's school, and reported that the school environment was welcoming, equitable and inclusive. Parent responses indicated some areas for attention, specifically in areas related to parent engagement, the provision of information related to mental health supports and community agencies and services, and the steps taken by the school to prevent and address bullying.

Thank you to all who participated. Information gathered from this survey will support school and Board planning processes.

Dental Screening Program 2014 - 2015

Dear Parent or Guardian:

Dental health contributes to our general health and well-being. **Dental screening** will be conducted at your child's school by registered dental hygienists for all children in Grades JK, SK, 2, 8, possibly Grades 4, 6 and others, as required by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care's Child Health Program under the *Ontario Public Health Standards and Protocols*. Dental screening consists of a quick look in the mouth **using a separate**, **sterilized mirror for each child**.

You will be notified if your child needs to see a dentist for treatment. Dental screening is done to identify children who are in need of urgent dental care; however, it does not take the place of a regular dental check-up.

If you do not have dental insurance and the cost of urgent care would create financial hardship, treatment may be funded through the **Children in Need of Treatment (CINOT)** program. Your child may also be eligible for the **Healthy Smiles Ontario (HSO)** dental program. This program provides funding for routine dental care and treatment such as check-ups, x-rays and fillings.

You will be notified if preventive dental services (professional cleaning, fluoride, pit and fissure sealants or dental health education) are recommended for your child. These services may be provided by the Dental Program within six months of this dental screening if your family does not have dental coverage and cannot pay for dental care.

If your child is not in one of the grades listed above and you would like to have him/her screened, contact the Dental Program at 905-895-4512 or 1-800-735-6625, extension 74395. Please be prepared to provide your child's full name, school, date of birth and grade.

If you wish to have your child excluded from dental screening, notify the Dental Program immediately, in writing to the address below, with your child's full name, school, date of birth and grade or call 905-895-4512 or 1-800-735-6625, extension 74395.

Please note that any information collected during your child's dental screening is done in agreement with the *Health Protection and Promotion Act*. Records of parent requests to exclude children from screening as well as requests for yearly screening will be maintained while the child remains in the stated school. In addition, the collection, use, disclosure, and disposal of this information is subject to the *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* and the *Personal Health Information Protection Act*.

Camp Sessions

We offer full day & half day sessions (morning or afternoon) For a COMPLETE camp experience, we recommend full day sessions as campers will receive a soccer focus in the morning & a fun leisure swim with camp games & activities in the afternoon. If you prefer only half days sessions and want the soccer portion, we recommend registering for the mornings.
