# **HELP WANTED**

School assistants play a critical and significant role as members of the school team. The period of time when school assistants are utilized is over the busy lunch hour. The role of the school assistant is to provide supervisory support to teaching staff during peak or critical periods of the school day. There are four main responsibilities for each school assistant. It is the expectation of the Board and the school that these duties be performed consistently, conscientiously and professionally, to ensure the utmost safety for the students. Supervision duties may include:

Noon hour supervision during lunch hour;

Supervision of children during bus loading and unloading;

Yard duty supervision;

Supervision of noon hour activities.

School assistants are paid \$12.11/hour.


