PROMOTING A GROWTH MINDSET

"In a growth mindset, people believe that their most basic abilities can be developed through dedication and hard work—brains and talent are just the starting point. This view creates a love of learning and a resilience that is essential for great accomplishment," (Dweck, 2013)

Before your child can learn mathematics, he or she needs to believe in his or her ability to do so. That's where you come in. You can be your child's 1_{st} role model for learning. When you engage with your child in a supportive, relaxed atmosphere, your child will enjoy exploring the world of mathematics. Doing Mathematics with Your Child, Kindergarten to Grade 6

Which One Doesn't Belong is a great activity that promotes mathematical thinking because there are many "right" answers - it all depends on their reasoning.

Show your child this picture:

Ask them, "which one doesn't belong? Why?"
