Thank-youRainbow flags have existed in many configurations representing many peoples and experiences throughout human history. The current Pride flag's exact colours and dimensions have changed from the Gilbert Baker flag, which first appeared as a representation of the LGBTQ+ community in 1977. Although the Rainbow flag is still strongly connected to the LGBTQ+ community, it also is a representation of social change cited as being a symbol of hope and peace. LGBTQ+ refers to Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer or Questioning. The + refers to people who identify as Intersex, Asexual or an Ally. The month of June is Pride month. Many of our students, staff, parents/guardians and community members identify as members of the Rainbow or LGBTQ+ community. Flying the Pride flag not only signals that our schools are safe spaces for everyone, it also aligns with our Vision Statement and Guiding Principles of inclusion and student and staff well-being and our new Equity Plan. Our school district is showing our acceptance and celebration of the LGBTQ community during Pride month by raising the Pride flag at schools and offices across the YRDSB. We believe that our schools are safe spaces for everyone. Everyone has the right to be treated with dignity and respect. Additionally, regardless of your personal values and beliefs, we all must follow the Ontario Human Rights Code that protects marginalized groups from discrimination and harassment. ## Raffle Basket Fundraiser

Dear Legacy Families,
Our School Fun Fair is coming up on Thursday, June $6^{\text {th }}$. We are hoping that this event might raise some funds for Legacy PS but more importantly, we wanted to host an event that would bring Legacy families together to celebrate the end of the school year.

So far this year, your fundraising dollars have gone to the following:

- Our incredible and engaging Forest of Reading program which provides our readers with new copies of Canadian literature (novels and picture books) to read, discuss and rate. This reading adventure is enjoyed by students in Kindergarten all the way to grade 8.
- Thirty new chrome books, 2 tech tubs for storage and 6 desk tops. This brings additional tech into our school but it also replaces dated and no longer working technology.
- Supporting our various school teams and other groups such as Me to We, attend tournaments and events. We use fundraising money to pay for a supply teacher so that a teacher/coach can attend an event. We also use some fundraising money to support the cost of additional tournaments.
- Supporting Grade 8 graduation, we use some fundraising dollars to ensure that our Graduates have a fun party to celebrate their successes at no cost to the families.
- Two school wide presentations for our students' learning and engagement.

This year, we are inviting every grade to create a basket for raffle. Families are asked to bring in a donation for their grade's basket. Each grade will have a basket theme - listed on page two - and we are asking families to donate an item to their child's class corresponding with that theme. Donated items should be new and
 gift cards (\$5-\$10) are welcome.

Please send your donations to school with your child. Donations will be accepted until Monday, June $4^{\text {th }}$. With your help, our Raffle Baskets will be a big success, fun for families and they will raise a little money for Legacy PS too.

## Legacy Raffle Basket Themes

Some suggested ideas are in brackets - but please feel free to be creative. Kindergarten - Crafts for Little Kids (crayons, markers, paint, Crayola items, colouring books)

Grade 1 - Toys Much Fun (small toys that kids like such as pokemon cards, squishies, little boxes of lego, small stuffed animals etc.)

Grade 2 - Spa Day! (nail polish, face masks, creams, lip balm)

Grade 3 - Arts and Crafts for Bigger Kids - (bead kits, crochet kits, crafts for kids 9 and up)

Grade 4 - Outdoor Play and BBQ - (Beach toys, outdoor play balls, water toys)

Grade 5 - I Love Chocolate and Candy - (chocolate bars, fun candy)

## HOW DOES IT WORK?

During the Fun Fair, students may come to the BOOK SwAP Tables and select a new book to take home. You may use the BOOK SWAP tickets received in advance from your own book donations to "purchase" these new-to-you books!

If you did not donate to the swap, NEVER FEAR! You may still purchase a donated book at the Fun Fair by purchasing FUN FAIR tickets for a dollar. What a steal! *Please note that the donation BOOK SWAP tickets may only be used for purchasing BOOK SWAP BOOKS at the fair.

BOOK DONATION CRITERIA To ensure our "donated" books are fit for swapping, please check out the criteria below before bringing in your items:
-Books may be paperback or hardcover, and should be appropriate for grades PreK-8 only (ie: no cookbooks, adult fiction, colouring/activity books, Happy Meal freebie books etc)
-Books must be in gently/good used condition: ie: cover is on, no rips, tears, or food stains
-Books with coloring or writing in them will be unable to be accepted
-Books with original owner names in the front covers are perfectly acceptable.
$\square$ Please note that the selection of books available to swap from will be based on the books donated. Please remember - your books are considered a DONATION :) We hope you will find another book to swap for, however, if not, please know your donation is greatly appreciated and we hope that another student will enjoy your special gift.
