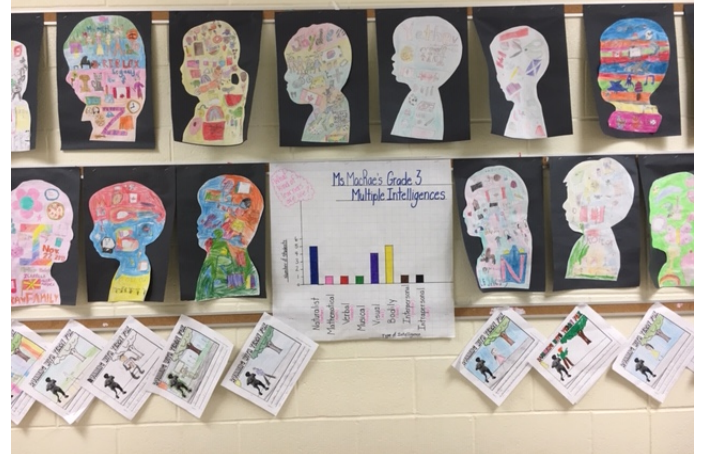
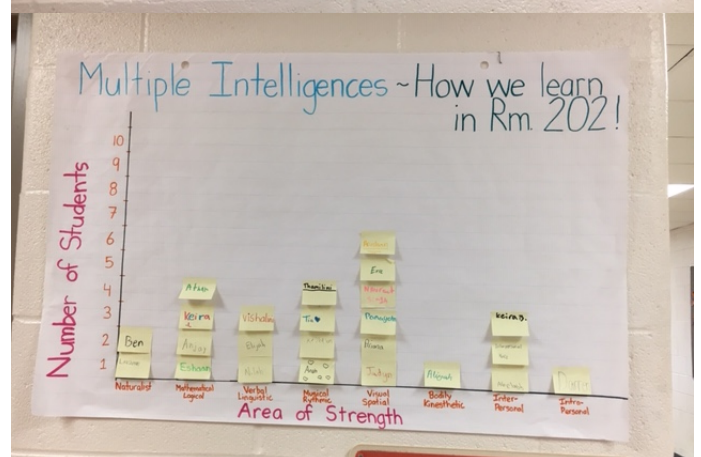
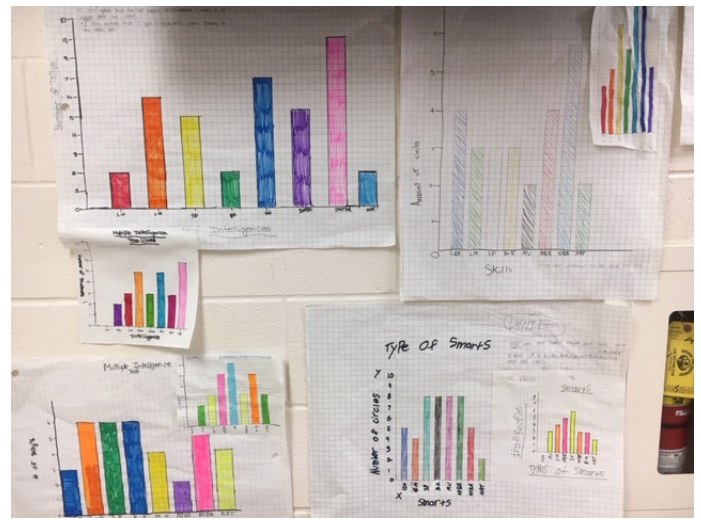
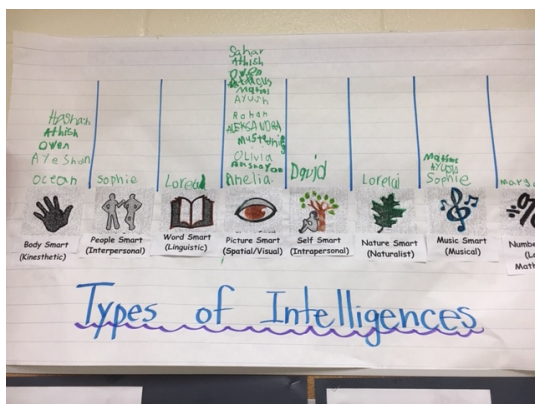


At Legacy Public School we have spent the weeks since school started getting to know our students so that we can use that information in planning lessons to meet their needs. This year, all students from Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8 have spent time learning about Multiple Intelligences. They have been learning that everyone has an area of learning that is their area of intelligence.

The theory of multiple intelligences was developed in 1983 by Dr. Howard Gardner, a professor of education at Harvard University. Howard Gardner felt that the traditional notion of intelligence, based on I.Q. testing, is far too limited and so he proposed eight different intelligences to account for a broader range of human potential in children and adults. These intelligences are:

- Linguistic intelligence ("word smart")
- Logical-mathematical intelligence ("number/reasoning smart")
- Spatial intelligence ("picture smart")
- Bodily-Kinesthetic intelligence ("body smart")
- Musical intelligence ("music smart")
- Interpersonal intelligence ("people smart")
- Intrapersonal intelligence ("self smart")
- Naturalist intelligence ("nature smart")

Each class has graphed the multiple intelligences of the students in their classroom. You can ask your older student "What is your area of intelligence?" or your younger student, "How are you smart?"



Legacy PS was lucky enough to be selected to participate in Eco Camp this year. The 3-day camp was held at Cedar Glen YMCA Outdoor Centre in King. Six students (Caitlyn, Michael, Zymal, Aidan, Kiran and Erika) attended and participated in a variety of learning experiences, while meeting and interacting with students from 15 other schools across the YRDSB. Hopefully these budding leaders will be able to use what they have learned to inspire other students at Legacy to care for the Earth and make choices to help us all live more sustainably. Legacy's Earth Club begins next week!
