National Indigenous History Month

Staff and students continued our First Nations learning this month to support our Truth and Reconciliation Commission and the Calls to Action to teach curriculum related to residential schools and Aboriginal history and commit to build student capacity for inter cultural understanding, empathy, and mutual respect.

Staff participated in a Blanket Exercise with YRDSB curriculum consultant Towana Brooks on Monday. The KAIROS Blanket Exercise is an interactive learning experience that teaches the Indigenous Rights history. Developed in response to the 1996 Report of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples — which recommended education on Canadian-Indigenous history as one of the key steps to reconciliation, the Blanket Exercise covers over 500 years of history in a one and a half hour participatory workshop.
