Recess Change

We have modified our recess time to a full outdoor 30 minute structure. Previously, students had 15 minutes for a snack break and 15 minutes of outdoor play. This change allows for students to have more outdoor play time. Research shows that physical activity and fresh air stimulates the brain and body and prepares students for learning. When children are outside they move more, sit less, and play/learn longer. (Position Statement on Outdoor Active Play, 2015) Morning snack times will be integrated either before or after morning recess in classes.
