Chanukah, the Jewish "Festival of Lights," also known as the "Feast of Dedication," begins at sunset. In Judaism, Chanukah is celebrated for eight days to commemorate the victory of Judah the Maccabee for religious freedom and rededication of the Temple in 165 B.C.E. and to celebrate the power of God and the faithfulness of Israel. During the celebration, the eight candles of the menorah, the Chanukah lamp, are lit one day at a time. Card-playing is traditionally associated with the festival, as is spinning the dreidel (a spinning top). Schools will be acknowledging the festival through a variety of activities that promote learning and understanding for all students. We join you in wishing students, staff and members of the community who will be lighting the menorah in their homes a joyful time of sharing.

## FAMILY MATH

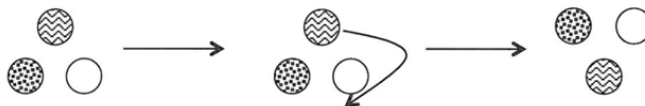
Anytime is a great time to start building routines at home which can support children in developing a positive disposition towards math. Providing opportunities at home that promote math talk can support a child's mathematical knowledge and understanding. Whether you are, shopping, cooking, playing a game, organizing, taking a walk, or reading, there are many opportunities to highlight math in different ways.

Try this problem:

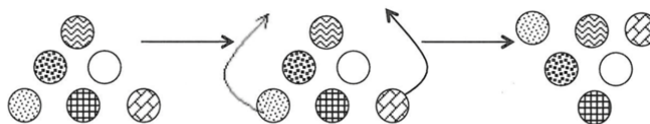
A game played with coins has the following rules.

1. Coins are set up in a triangle.
2. Coins are moved until the triangle is upside down.
3. The number of moves is recorded.

For example, if a two-layer triangle is used, then only one move is required to flip the triangle.



A three-layer triangle would only require two moves.



How many moves would a triangle with 5 layers require?
