- 552 students

- Restorative Practices Approach to Solving Conflicts

- Work on Culturally Responsive Pedagogy-Want to see our school identities reflected in our classrooms and curriculum
- Continue work with building greater math fundamentals to apply to problem solving
- Shelley shares fundraising plan-slide
- Pavement painting is a result of Student Council funds
- Active School Travel Pilot-painting on the sidewalks to encourage students to walk to school
- Sandi asked if the items on the fundraising plan also reflects needs of Primary Division ie equipment, technology, assemblies and if there could be more trips? We would like to ensure we balance the costs of trips (two trips per year is norm)
- Saumea-asks how they could find out about extra-curricular activities for primary? Could there be funds allocated for activities for the primaries. There seems to be more activities for junior and intermediate. How might we support this communication for parents? Suggestion to have grades added to the activities in the school in the ebulletin or on the calendar to help parents know what they can encourage their children to become involved with.
- Shelley summarizes the school re-organization process. Primary classes are too high and need to be capped at 20. We were able to hire a teacher and a 2/3 class was created. We were also called last week and we were able to create a new junior class 4/5. All new teachers have been hired.
- Shelley shares the challenges of determining an overnight trip ie Pinecrest, Ottawa. There are challenges having all students attend an overnight trip for a variety of reasons. Shelley and Leeanne will be meeting with the teachers about planning an overnight trip. Some parents indicated that they would really like to see the teachers

organize these overnight trips and have these trips continue from year to year. Natasha asked to table this conversation about field trips for another time and ensure communication about trips is shared with all families. Shelley indicated that communication would go out to grade 8 parents once a decision has been made.
