Response to Covid-19 at Legacy

- Teachers have demonstrated proper hand washing technique to students and they review the protocol and remind students to wash their hands regularly.
- Hand washing posters have been put up in every classroom and washroom.
- Communication to families has included information about the importance of staying home when ill especially if a child has a fever or a cough.

Purchasing: for 2019/2020:

- Basketball uniforms have been ordered
