## Achievements:

I am pleased to say that the 2017/18 school council year was very successful. We had 22 dedicated parent members that include 12 voting members and one teacher - Ms. Sylvia Vocino - and one school support staff - Mr. Michael Reali. We had phenomenal support from our Principal - Ms. Shelly Jones and our Vice Principal - Ms. Leeanne Hoover-Joy. This year we formed various committees to support the school and their various initiatives. The list is as follows: Safety Committee, School Lunches Committee, Grants Committee, Fundraising Committee, Charity Committee, Bylaws Committee, Legacy Spirit Wear Committee

As part of some of our initiatives, we ran a School Safety Blitz in February to highlight the importance of safe parking, safe lunch drop-off routines, and addressing other safety concerns inside and outside the school. The Safety Committee also spearheaded a "city pilot project" that reminds parents about the required speed limits at pick-up and drop-off times.

Our Charity Drive focused on 360 Kids this year to highlight the need to support underprivileged youth in the community. Our fundraiser was a Read-a-Thon which encouraged parents to participate in reading with their child.

The Grants Committee collaborated with the school to apply for the Speak Up Grant for grade sevens and eights, and the PRO Grant for mindfulness workshops for families for the upcoming school year.

One of our dedicated parents published a monthly newsletter that highlighted council and student achievements and was sent out to all the parents of the school by the school administration.

Another of our dedicated parents runs our Twitter account to engage parents and keep them informed on council activities and encourage parent participation.

The funds raised from our annual fundraiser, school lunches, and Legacy Spirit Wear have supported the technology match for this year, outdoor play equipment for all classes, and construction of an outdoor classroom. We have also helped subsidise the grade six and grade eight overnight trips for families in financial need. We also supported the cost associated with an annual lice check.

Overall we had a very productive school year.

## Suggestions:

- 1. We would appreciate if we could get more resources to help us engage parents for whom English is a second language. Help with translation for agendas, newsletters, and documentations in various languages would be much appreciated.
- 2. I have had a few requests from parents of special needs students to introduce a pilot project so that they could have access to speech therapy and occupational therapy at the school, and do not have to drive their kids to other locations for these services.
- 3. I would like to see more resources and more initiatives to teach all students the value of kindness, empathy, and inclusivity. This would help tackle a lot of bullying issues.
