
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
From the Principal's Desk

In the case where we do not hear from a parent and we have been unable to reach a parent to verify an absence, it is the policy of York District School Board to contact the Police and report the child as missing.

Student Safety

It has been brought to our attention that when students are walking to and from school, some of them are not remembering the safety rules.

Students should always be crossing the street at the corner (and not in the middle of the street) and looking both ways before crossing if there is no crossing guard. Older siblings should be making sure that their younger siblings are with them as they cross safely.

As well, some students are playing with soccer or tennis balls as they are walking. If they lose control of the balls and they roll out into the street, they should not be darting out after them.

Forks & Spoons

If your child stays for lunch and brings an item that



requires a spoon or fork, please remember to send one with him/her. We have many students who come to the office daily to get an utensil from us and unfortunately, we have limited available. We suggest that you keep a plastic spoon or fork in your child's lunch bag each day so that he/she has one if needed.

Plastic Bag Grab challenge: April 16 - 20, 2018

The Plastic Bag Grab challenge is a waste reduction program for elementary schools across Canada that engages schools and students on the 3Rs hierarchy: reduce, reuse, and recycle.

For two years, the challenge has encouraged students to collect as many single-use plastic bags from their homes and communities as they can for recycling.

Now in its third year, the program will focus on **reduce** and **reuse** – the most important step in the 3Rs hierarchy. **As such, the challenge will reward schools that encourage and promote ideas and solutions that result in reducing how many bags are used and wasted in their communities.**

During Earth Week 2018 (April 16-20), schools are challenged to learn and take action on plastics waste by reducing their use, while collecting discarded plastic bags for recycling in their schools and beyond.

So what should you do?

- 1. Try to REDUCE the # of plastic bags you use by bringing your own, reusable bags EVERY time you go shopping!
- 2. REUSE plastic bags that you have they can be used in many ways!
- 3. RECYCLE the bags you don't need bring them to Walmart or various grocery stores which recycle them!
- 4. OR during EARTH WEEK bring them to the school and we will count them and recycle them for you!

SIGN IN/OUT For Visitors/Volunteers

We have noticed that from time to time parents/grandparents come to the school during recess and go right out to the yard to look for their children. For safety reasons, we ask that a<u>ll visitors and volunteers</u>, whether family members or other community members, sign in at the main office when entering the school. You will then get a "Visitor" badge to wear while you are here. If there is an urgent matter and you need to locate your child during recess, we will page your child from the office and have him/her come in from the yard to see you. Although it may be tempting to do so, please do not go straight from the parking lot to the yard. For the safety of the children, Staff on Yard Duty have been asked to approach any adults on the yard without a Visitor/Volunteer Badge to re-direct them to the office. If you are coming to the school for an event or to meet with a staff member please remember, you must sign in at the office, get a visitor's badge and let the office know where you are heading before a school visit. Thank you for your support and understanding in these matters.

Overall, we thought You're the Chef was an amazing experience. We had the chance to cook and bake some delectable foods and we were able to do it with our friends.














Little Rouge Outdoor Classroom April Update
