#### The 'Golden Garbage Can' Award





#### Police Checks for Volunteers

At our May School Council meeting the issue of police checks for volunteers was discussed. This includes volunteers who help in the school, go on class trips and drive students to sporting activities or other events.

According to the YRDSB Policy and Procedure #280 Volunteers in our Schools, it is best practice that all volunteers hold a valid PVSC (Police Vulnerable Sector Check). The School Council members voted and agreed that this policy should be put in place at Little Rouge for the safety and security of the students, as well as the volunteers themselves.



Volunteers are an important part of the Little Rouge school community and we hope that you will see the importance of having this done and continue to support the students and staff through volunteering both in and out of the school setting.

Please see the details below of how to obtain a police check. If you would like to get one done over the summer so that it can be ready for the beginning of school, please call the office and we can send a letter home that you will need to take with you to get the check completed. If you already have a police check that has been done for another organization, please bring the original copy to the school so that we can determine whether or not it satisfies our board 's policy.

**Cost** – There is \$30 fee provided the school supplies a letter stating that the person is going to be volunteering in the school (upon request, we will provide you with a school letter).

#### How to get one:

- A) In person Richmond Hill Yonge/Elgin Mills 10720 Yonge Street (the Stouffville location is now closed) if everything is fine with the police check it can usually be done in about 10 minutes (Hours M-F 8 6, Sat. 8 4)
- B) On-line takes about 7 10 days. You would be notified when it is ready and can pick it up at the nearest police station but must bring ID (see below for acceptable ID) most stations open 24 hours

#### ID is required for in person or online application

You will need to provide 2 pieces of government ID – one with a photo so passports and driver 's licenses are fine but no health cards or SIN cards.

If a person does not have a driver 's license they can bring a recent piece of mail with their address on it but they still require photo ID.

#### Preventing "Summer Slide"

Curriculum Corner Summer is fast approaching and with it will come fun times outdoors, relaxing moments and the possibility of "summer slide". "Summer slide" is the term used to describe any educational loss in skills that occurs over the summer. Children who continue to read over the summer continue to grow and those who do not read experience a decline in their reading skills. According to Richard Allington, professor of literacy at the University of Tennessee, the "loss can be as much as three months for the average student... and three to five months for struggling readers." (2009, Knoxville News Sentinel Co.)

However, children should not spend the summer cooped up indoors completing worksheets. Here are some meaningful, but fun, ways to keep kids' brains working over the summer:

Talk about what you are each reading (parents included!) and tell each other what you like or dislike about the text.
Visit the public library as a family outing. Walking there is a great way to be active at the same time.
Have your child research the places they want to visit for the summer and determine the itinerary for the visit.


# Protect yourself against West Nile virus and Lyme disease

If you are heading outdoors to keep active, go camping or work in your garden, protect yourself and your family against West Nile virus and Lyme disease. West Nile virus is spreadto humans through the bite of an infected mosquito; Lyme disease is spread through thebite of an infected blacklegged tick.



#### What you can do:

- Cover up when you go outdoors with light coloured long sleeved shirts and pants
- Use an insect repellent containing DEET
- Check yourself and your children for ticks
- Remove attached ticks as quickly as possible
- Clean up standing water around your home where mosquitoes like to breed
