School Bus Information




For school bus information please go online to: www.schoolbuscity.com

This site will give you bus stops, pick-up and drop-off times. You must be at your designated pick-up 10 minutes prior to the stated time. Students under the age of 10 years require an adult to be present at the drop off stop. If no adult is present the student will stay on the bus and be returned to the school where you must pick them up immediately.

If buses are 10 minutes late or more please consult the website for late bus details, please do not call the school as we do not have any further details.

During inclement weather if the buses DO NOT run in the morning, they will NOT run in the afternoon. If they do pick up in the morning they WILL drop off in the afternoon.

weather. Warm boots, socks, pants, sweaters, coats, hats, mittens and scarves tucked inside the coat are very important for children of all ages to wear. Children will be expected to be outside during recess and lunch, so please make sure they are dressed for the weather.

As well, since we have approximately 500 students here at Little Rouge, and many children wear the same brands, colours and sizes of clothing, it would be very helpful if your child's name could be printed in ink in boots and labels of clothing. If your child has lost any



items, please check our Lost and Found box just outside the Caretaker's office. It is always a good idea to send extra clothing with younger students as accidents do happen or they get wet on the way to school with rain or snow.

Halloween is just around the corner! If your child's teacher has special plans for the class, she/he will notify you.



Reminder: If your child is wearing a Halloween costume to school, please refrain from having them bring replica weapons to school (e.g. guns, swords) even if they are part of the costume. Thank you for your support with this matter.

If your child is going to be away from the school or will be arriving late for any reason, please contact the office with this information. If you are calling between 4:30 p.m. and 8:30 a.m. of the following morning, you can leave a message on our answering machine.

Confirming the whereabouts of every absent child can take quite awhile and could result in a child being missing for some time. Board policy dictates that if a student has not arrived at school, and all attempts to contact the parents have been unsuccessful, then our next step will be to contact the police and report the child as missing.

Safety Awareness and Preparedness

The York Region District School Board is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students. Throughout the course of the year, all schools in the York Region District School Board conduct emergency preparedness exercises. To date, we have already conducted two of six fire drills and one of our two practice Lockdown Drills. In advance of our first drill, we reviewed protocols during an emergency with all students so that they understand the purpose and know what to expect.


All of our runners finished with determination and proudly represented Little Rouge!

EQAO - School Results

We have received the 2015-2016 results of the Provincial Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary Division (Grades 1-3) and Junior Division (Grade 4-6). As you can see from the graphs below, our Little Rouge Grade 3 and 6 students performed well, scoring, in most cases, above the Board and the Provincial averages. Please keep in mind that the student contextual data differs from year to year, e.g. the number of exempt students, the number of students identified with special needs, the number of ELL students, and specific context pieces do impact the overall results. Our staff will be analyzing the results and disaggregating the data and we will use this information to help us with our plans for overall school improvement. The EQAO testing results are a snapshot of achievement and is used along with other schoolbased assessments to plan for improved student achievement. Ongoing classroom assessments remain a fundamental method of determining each student's strengths and needs as we plan for each student's success.



Dear Parent/Guardian

On the basis of parent feedback and support received last year, the School Council has decided to continue the Investment in Education Program (IIEP) for this school year.

Thanks to the generous donations received last year the School Council was able to purchase playground equipment, make much needed enhancements to the playground, and contribute to the purchase of school supplies (e.g. math resources) and to fun learning activities such as Jungle Sports. In addition, the school was able to utilize proceeds from the Board's IIEP cost sharing program to purchase chrome books.

What is the IIEP?

The IIEP is a common program among schools in York Region which involves parents making an optional donation to the school through the School Council. Funds donated will be used in areas such as:

- 1. Technology the Board has a cost sharing program that matches funds raised by the school up to a specified amount (this past year the matching amount was 1:1.5 which meant for every \$1 raised by the school, the Board would match it at \$1.50)
- 2. Outdoor equipment e.g. balls, hoops, etc. for recess play
- 3. Mathematics and the Arts e.g. math teaching resources, musical instruments, visual art supplies
- 4. Athletics e.g. equipment, uniforms
- 5. Presentation e.g. performances, guest speakers, etc.

The IIEP offers a number of advantages:

- A. Donations of \$25 or more, paid by cheque, are fully tax-deductible and receipts would be issued by the Board, however, any amount would be appreciated.
- B. 100% of the funds raised goes directly to our students. There are no administrative costs involved.
- C. Our objective is for the IIEP to replace all other fund raising activities on behalf of the School Council. Families would therefore not be asked to engage in other fundraising activities such as selling items, which we recognize was often done by parents/quardians.

How will decisions regarding fund allocations be made?

Decisions regarding where funds will be allocated will be made collaboratively by the School Council, staff and administration based on the school's overall needs and plan for continuous improvement priorities.


