


EQAO - School Results

We have received the 2016-2017 results of the Provincial Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary Division (Grades 1-3) and Junior Division (Grade 4-6). Please keep in mind that the student contextual data differs from year to year, e.g. the number of exempt students, the number of students identified with special needs, the number of ELL students, and specific context pieces do impact the overall results. Our staff will be analyzing the results and disaggregating the data and we will use this information to help us with our plans for overall school improvement. The EQAO testing results are a snapshot of achievement and is used along with other school based assessments to plan for improved student achievement. Ongoing classroom assessments remain a fundamental method of determining each student's strengths and needs as we plan for each student's success.

COMMUNITY TRAFFIC SAFETY

SLOW DOWN, SCHOOL ZONE!

On Thursday September 14th, the Grade 6 students got to help out with keeping our community and school zone safe! Partnering with the York Regional Police, our school campaigned to improve road safety. Together, we made sure that our school community was safe for pedestrians and helped out with drivers speed limits and safety rules within the law. The classes made colourful posters that would give drivers on the road an important message to go by, like wear your seat



belt, make a full stop, don't speed, don't text and drive, etc. Along with that, if drivers did speed or not follow a driving rule, the police officer would direct the driver to pull over. The students would then give the driver an imitation ticket and a warning with an important safety message.

We learned how to use a radar and checked for drivers who were speeding. The grade 6's got to share their experience on the news and it spread awareness to everyone.

The police taught us the importance of being safe and careful and what it means to take responsibility on the road. The students had a lot of fun and feel great that they've now shared many important traffic safety messages with the Little Rouge community!

Confirming the whereabouts of every absent child can take quite awhile and could result in a child being missing for some time. <u>Board policy dictates that if a</u> <u>student has not arrived at school, and all attempts</u> to contact the parents have been unsuccessful, then our next step will be to contact the police and report the child as missing. **Halloween** is just around the corner! If your child's teacher has special plans for the class, she/he will notify you.

<u>Reminder</u>: If your child is wearing a Halloween costume to school, <u>please refrain from</u> <u>having them bring replica weapons to school</u> (e.g. guns, swords) even if they are part of the <u>costume</u>. Thank you for your support with this matter.
