From the Principal's Desk

The Little Rouge staff would like to welcome back all of our families from last year, and to extend a very warm "Little Rouge Welcome" to all of our new families joining the school community. We certainly trust that everyone had a very relaxing and enjoyable summer. Our staff have worked very hard, to prepare the school and their classrooms to be ready for the students. I know you will agree with me that they have done a great job!

The elementary years are crucial to your child's long-term success. In these years, children will learn to read, write, do mathematics, problem solve and work with others. They will learn appropriate work habits as well as the skills, knowledge and habits of mind needed for success in school and beyond. We believe a strong partnership between home and school is essential for this development.

During school hours, teachers work with students and are committed to ensuring the success of each individual. By the end of kindergarten we expect students to have developed emergent literacy skills and by the end of grade one we expect every child to read. We work hard to ensure that all students achieve these goals. In addition to focused classroom teaching, we provide intensive instruction through our Reading Recovery and Special Education programs for students who need additional support. After school, parents have an important responsibility for supporting the work students do at school and for extending learning beyond the classroom. Parents demonstrate both through their words and actions that school is important and valuable. The time children spend outside of school with parents exceeds the time spent at school with teachers and it is very important for learning. The quality time parents spend with their children in a variety of activities, both in the home and on family outings, supports the quality programs which we implement in the school setting. Your child's education is a shared partnership. We look forward to working together with you to ensure your child's academic success.

Code of Behaviour/Expectations of Students

Over the next few weeks, Ms. Dodds, Mr. Demacio and the staff will be reviewing the code of behaviour and expectations for the students. In addition, reviewing and discussing the code of behaviour with your child would be appreciated. We are confident that the discussions at school and home will explain the policies and help to keep Little Rouge a safe place for our students to work and play.

Dropping Off Children at School

Students who do not take a bus should be walking to school every day. Walking to school promotes a healthy life-style, encourages older students to be responsible for younger children, gives students an opportunity to socialize with friends, and much more. Fewer vehicles in front of the school reduces traffic congestion and lowers pollution levels in the schoolyard during drop-off times.

Teachers are on duty 15 minutes before the start of school in the morning (8:45 a.m.) and 20 minutes before school after the lunch hour (1:30 p.m.). Please ensure that the students do not arrive prior to these times as the yard will not be adequately supervised and we want all of our students to be safe.

**If you need to drop off your child by car, please use the loop around the parking lot. We ask that you do not use the bus loop due to limited space and safety. **In the past at other schools there have been close calls and some scary incidents.

Please **do not park your car in our drive through lanes as this significantly inconveniences other parents who are trying to get to work on time. Kindly **do not leave your cars running or idling** as it creates a harmful impact on the environment.

Your cooperation in these matters will ensure the safe arrival and departure of all of our students. Thank you!

Medical Information:



It's very important that the school be informed if your child has a medical condition.

If your child currently has a medical condition that you have not informed us about, please contact the office immediately. There are required forms that must be completed so that in the event of an emergency, all school staff will be prepared to take the necessary action.

Indoor Shoes

Indoor shoes with non-marking soles are essential to keep our classroom carpets and floors dry and clean. Please ensure that your child has a pair of shoes that can be left at school. Please also make sure that your child's name is inside the shoes. Children are not permitted to wear wet outdoor running shoes or boots in the classrooms.

Stocking feet are dangerous in the event of a fire drill.

Child Safety

When dropping off or signing out students please report to the office.

Please ensure all other caregivers are aware of this procedure as we want to keep all our children safe.



Parent Meetings with Staff

As a continued measure of safety in the school, we would like to remind all parents that if they have scheduled a meeting with a staff member, they should report to the office to sign in our visitor book and get a visitor badge. As well, please let Mrs. Hooper or Mrs. Lee who you are meeting with and they will call up to the staff member to ensure that he/she is ready for your meeting. Once this has happened, you are welcome to head up to the classroom. Thank you for your support in following this procedure.

Birthday Celebrations



Lockdowns and Fire Drills





During Safety Week, teachers may be discussing a variety of safety related topics with their students. Safety topics are also taught as part of the Physical Education and Health curriculum at various points in the school year.

A Lockdown Drill is also held during Safety Week. A Lockdown Drill is intended to prepare the students in the event of a real emergency. Although situations threatening the safety of our children are extremely rare, it is important that students know how to react. To minimize any fear, particularly with our younger students, teachers will be preparing their students ahead of time. One further Lockdown Drill will be held later in the year.

Throughout the school year, the students in all York Region schools participate in 6 fire drills. The first drill will be announced to the school and the others are "surprise" drills. In addition, the Markham Fire Department visits each school and has a "surprise" drill for us.

School Bus Information



For school bus information please go online to: www.schoolbuscity.com

This site will give you bus stops, pick-up and drop-off times. You must be at your designated pick-up 10 minutes prior to the stated time. To help ensure student safety, Student Transportation recommends Grades JK-1 students are met at the bus stop by a parent/guardian and age appropriate arrangements made for all other grades. If no adult is present the student will stay on the bus and be returned to the school where you must pick them up **immediately.**

If buses are 10 minutes late or more please consult the website for late bus details, please do not call the school as we do not have any further details.

During inclement weather if the buses DO NOT run in the morning, they will NOT run in the afternoon. If they do pick up in the morning they WILL drop off in the afternoon.

Police Checks for Volunteers

REGIONAL PROPERTY OF THE PROPE

At our May 2016 School Council meeting the issue of police checks for volunteers was discussed. This includes volunteers who help in the school, go on class trips and drive students to sporting activities or other events.

According to the YRDSB Policy and Procedure #280 Volunteers in our Schools, it is best practice that all volunteers hold a valid PVSC (Police Vulnerable Sector Check). The School Council members voted and agreed that this policy should be put in place at Little Rouge for the safety and security of the students, as well as the volunteers themselves.

Volunteers are an important part of the Little Rouge school community and we hope that you will see the importance of having this done and continue to support the students and staff through volunteering both in and out of the school setting.

Please see the details below of how to obtain a police check. If you would like to get one done over the summer so that it can be ready for the beginning of school, please call the office and we can send a letter home that you will need to take with you to get the check completed. If you already have a police check that has been done for another organization, please bring the original copy to the school so that we can determine whether or not it satisfies our board 's policy.

Cost – There is \$30 fee provided the school supplies a letter stating that the person is going to be volunteering in the school (upon request, we will provide you with a school letter).

How to get one:

- A) In person Richmond Hill Yonge/Elgin Mills 10720 Yonge Street (the Stouffville location is now closed) if everything is fine with the police check it can usually be done in about 10 minutes (Hours M-F 8 6, Sat. 8 4)
- B) On-line takes about 7 10 days. You would be notified when it is ready and can pick it up at the nearest police station but must bring ID (see below for acceptable ID) most stations open 24 hours

ID is required for in person or online application

You will need to provide 2 pieces of government ID – one with a photo so passports and driver 's licenses are fine but no health cards or SIN cards.

If a person does not have a driver 's license they can bring a recent piece of mail with their address on it but they still require photo ID.

The York Region Board of Education has always believed that education is a shared responsibility involving a partnership of students, parents, staff and community. School Councils have been mandated by the Government of Ontario to be an advisory body which may make recommendations to the school principal or to the Board. The purpose is to support improved student learning and to support an increased sense of shared accountability for public education. Please consider taking an active role in our Council. We will meet for approximately one hour 6 times a year. We will be looking for a School Council Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary and Treasurer as well as voting members and general membership.

Chair:

Call Council meeting and organize the Agenda with input from the Principal

Chair the meetings; facilitate committee work

Communicate with the Principal on a regular basis regarding school issues

Ensure that minutes are recorded, parents are consulted, fundraising meets Board policies, and the council Constitution is reviewed annually

Treasurer:

Maintain accurate records of financial transactions (this is now done with the school's secretary as all funds go through the Board's Cash Net System)

Provide a Financial Report to Council at each meeting

Secretary:

Record the minutes of the meetings

Provide a write-up of the minutes to members within 2 weeks of the meeting

Ensure minutes are passed at the next meeting and amended as needed

Post on school's website and Community Board for community viewing

General Membership:

Maintain a school-wide perspective on issues

Regularly attend school council meetings

Participate in information and training programs

Act as a link between the school council and the community

Encourage the participation of all parents

Participate on sub-committees that support the school's goals and contribute to a positive school climate for your children

If you are interested in any of these positions, please complete the nomination form in the start up package and return it to the school. Elections or acclamations will occur at our first Council meeting on October 2, 2017.

Medic Alert's 'No Child Without' Program at our school

The **No Child Without** program offers a free MedicAlert membership to students who attend our school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis then you should consider a MedicAlert membership through this program. MedicAlert is your child's voice in an emergency.

MedicAlert membership;

MedicAlert bracelet or necklet
□□ Enables first responders to quickly obtain up to date medical information by
means of the child's Electronic Health Record through the 24 Hour
Emergency Hotline.
Communicates with the parent or emergency contact upon activation of the Hotline

□ Allows free updates of the child's medical record as needed
 □ MedicAlert identification can alert school staff, friends, coaches and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur.
