Our School Hours

You are all reminded of school entry, recess and dismissal times. We encourage students to be on time for school, as late arrivals cause disruptions to a class that is already in session. **If your child will be absent, or late, please contact the school.** Additionally, if a student needs to leave early for an appointment, please send a note to your child's teacher that morning with the details thus eliminating the need for the office to have to call into the classroom and disrupt the class. Where possible, arrangements should be made ahead of time.

"O Canada" and announcements have been moved between 10:05-10:15 (when most of our classes are eating snacks before recess) in order to maximize learning time. Thus it is imperative that your child comes to school between 8:00-8:15 as instruction begins promptly at 8:15. Consider that dropping your child off 5 minutes late, waiting at the office to get a late slip, then going to his/her hook/locker can result in your child missing 10-15 minutes of instruction in a 40 minute period.

When your child will be absent from school, please take a moment to call to advise us of the absence. If you need to call before the school day begins, we have an answering machine available between 4:00pm and 8:00am to take your message. You can call whenever it is convenient for you. Please make sure you speak slowly and clearly, providing details of the absence. A call is required each day of the absence.

This is part of the YRDSB Safe Arrival Program.

If we do not receive a call, or if we cannot contact a parent/guardian or one of the emergency contacts listed, Board policy is for the school to notify York Region Police.

ANAPHYLAXIS. Let's work together to save a life!

Anaphylaxis Alert

Anaphylaxis occurs when the body perceives an allergen as a potential poison and as a "preventative measure", the body systematically shuts down. Anaphylaxis can be characterized by swelling, hives, difficulty breathing, abdominal cramps, vomiting, diarrhea, circulatory collapse, coma and death. Anaphylactic shock can lead to death in a matter of minutes if left untreated. Anaphylaxis is the same, whether the triggering agent is peanut, milk or anything else. Mackenzie Glen has students and staff members who are anaphylactic. As a result, we do not allow any peanut or products that may contain nuts at school.

Students with potentially deadly allergies are protected under a private member's bill that requires all Ontario school boards have protection plans for students at risk for anaphylaxis. Bill 3 or Sabrina's Law, was named after 13 year old Sabrina Shannon. Sabrina died in September 2003 after eating French fries contaminated with a dairy product at her school.

The food allergens found to most frequently cause reactions are: milk, peanuts, tree nuts, shellfish, eggs, fish, soy, sesame seed and wheat.

The most important aspect of the management of people with life threatening allergies is *avoidance*. In the event of contact with the offending allergen, epinephrine (Adrenaline) by injection is the treatment of choice. At Mackenzie Glen P.S. we have children who are allergen sensitive. As a precaution, their parents have been advised to supply their child with an EPI-PEN that can be used in an emergency situation. Of course, we are committed to providing an environment wherein the possibility of contact with an allergen is severely limited.

Anaphylaxis: How can you help?

It will take the understanding, empathy and cooperation of everyone in our school community to ensure that we create and maintain a safe environment for all of our children. For most of us, this will mean a small change in our eating habits. Ensuring that your child does not bring food containing nuts- particularly peanut butter and any tree nuts - will help tremendously. Even contact with a small trace of peanut butter, invisible to the naked eye, can cause an anaphylactic reaction. Make sure your children understand that they are not allowed to share food with others. Please note that "fake peanut butter" and "fake Nutella" are not allowed at school.

If your child is prone to anaphylactic reactions you must complete a medical information form available at the office. This form must be returned to the school as soon as possible. Your child must wear their Epi –Pen in a pouch. Students who have an Epi-Pen will be photographed. The photo will be posted in different areas of the school. In this way, the staff can familiarize themselves with those children most likely to suffer an anaphylactic reaction. All Staff, including our lunch assistants, receive training in the administration of the Epi-Pen in the event of an emergency.

Birthday Parties and Play Dates

Children with severe food allergies should not be omitted from birthday parties, sleepovers, and/or play dates. Many of these children already feel isolated by their allergy and want desperately to be included like everyone else in the normal activities of childhood. Parents /Guardians of anaphylactic children are well versed in the simple precautions that need to be in place to ensure their child's safety. If you have questions about how you can accommodate a child's needs while he/she is in your home or at your child's birthday party, please contact the child's parents/guardians for more information.

A REMINDER TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS AND STUDENTS THAT WE DO NOT ALLOW BIRTHDAY TREATS OR OTHER SNACKS TO BE DISTRIBUTED AT SCHOOL.

School Security

All YRDSB schools have been outfitted with a front door buzzer and surveillance system. Beginning earlier this year, the front doors will continue to be locked at 8:30 am. Visitors and family members will be required to ring the buzzer and may need to wait to be buzzed in by the office staff.

Dropping off items: Currently, there are many families dropping off lunches, homework, and various other items. <u>To avoid having to wait to be buzzed in</u>, we highly recommend that families send all lunches and materials needed with your child in the morning.

Classroom Interruptions: We do our best not to interrupt instructional time for our students. Unless it is an emergency, if you are calling to leave a message for your child we will wait until recess or the end of the day to deliver the message. The same will occur for items dropped off during the day. Of course, plans made ahead of time are best as it limits the interruptions to the school day.

We thank you for your cooperation to ensure the safety of each of our students.

Student Busing Eligibility

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.
