IB Diploma Programme Course of Study



Over the course of a two year programme:

Six academic subjects from six subject groups



IB Terminology

HL (Higher Level) course

= 3 semesters of course work

SL (Standard Level) courses

= 2 semesters of course work

- 3 subjects at the HL level
- 3 subjects at the SL Level

Complete the IB Core:

- Extended Essay
- Theory of Knowledge
- Creativity, Activity and Service





Timetable Considerations

- Students have a full timetable
- Students do not have space in their timetable for spares or non-IB courses
- Students are only able to take two sciences
 - this means that students cannot take all three during day school





IB Programme Fees

\$3,000.00 Total

- \$250 in grade 9
 - the grade 9 fee is payable at time of acceptance of offer of admission
- \$350 in grade 10
- \$1,200.00 per year in Grade 11 and Grade 12
- These fees cannot be used as tax deductions

- Incidentals as needed for the Programme




The YRDSB family of schools offers approximately 500 spaces each year for future IB students.








School Locator

- Enter your current home address to determine which schools serve your home




- The School Locator application only recognizes Region of York addresses for school attendance.

School Year on School Locator



Step 1: Register through EDSBY

Step 2: Report Cards

YRDSB Applicants

 We will receive report card data for current YRDSB students from the YRDSB system. Applicants are not required to take action

Non-YRDSB Applicants

 Students who are applying from outside of the YRDSB should email a scanned copy of each page and side of the Final Grade 7 Report Card to the IB site coordinator. Please include all subjects, learning skills and comments in your scan

Step 3: Portfolio (Asynchronous)

- The Personal Portfolio is an opportunity for students to tell us about themselves
- Students are asked to think about the life experiences that they have had and to choose three (3) artifacts that represent how these life experiences have shaped them as individuals
- For each artifact students should, in 75 words or less:
 - explain what they have learned about themselves from the experience and explain how they can apply this learning in the future





Portfolio Details

For the purpose of this task, an artifact is a visual or graphic representation of an experience.

Examples of experiences may include:

- a life event
- a trip you have taken
- a community event
- a personal accomplishment
- participation in an activity
- involvement in the creation of something
- the practice of a tradition
- a responsibility you have taken





Portfolio Goals

- The portfolio provides an opportunity for applicants to share something about themselves
- When you are deciding what to include, select experiences/artifacts that are meaningful to YOU
- This is a PERSONAL Portfolio
 - We are hoping to learn about the applicant
 - To help us do this we encourage students to work independently, and honestly





Personal Portfolio Next Steps

- For now, students can think about what experiences they would like to include, and how they might want to represent them as artifacts
- Information about submitting the Portfolio will be sent to the student's email address after 4:00 p.m. on Friday, November 12, 2021
 - For YRDSB students this address will be their YRDSB gapps account
 - For students who are not currently in the YRDSB system, the email will be sent to the student email address entered on the EDSBY application form



Formatting and Submitting the Portfolio

- In the email you will receive:
 - a review of the instructions for completing the Portfolio
 - a template for formatting the Portfolio as a Google
 Slide presentation
 - instruction about how to submit your finished Portfolio
- You will have 10 days to work on your portfolio

The submission due date is:

9:00 p.m. on Monday, November 22, 2021





Portfolio Tips

- We encourage students to read the guiding questions and consider their responses carefully
- Remember review the template for tips on how to format each slide
- Once it is submitted, students will not be able to edit the content

Submit by: 9:00 p.m. Monday, November 22, 2021





Step 4: Synchronous Assessment

- During the EDSBY application process, applicants will select an assessment day and time
- The assessment will be hosted virtually
- One (1) day before their assessment day, students will receive an email invitation with a link to join a virtual meeting
 - For YRDSB students this email will be sent to their YRDSB gapps account
 - For students who are not currently in the YRDSB system, the email will be sent to the student email address entered on the EDSBY application form



The Assessment Task

- During the virtual meeting, the teacher will share a prompt with the group
- Students will have 45 minutes to plan, write and edit their response to the prompt
- The student response should be written in full sentences and organized in paragraph form
- We will be reading answers both for the ideas that you share, and for the clear communication of those ideas

Assessment Task Details and Tips

- Students will submit their written responses through a Google Form
- The teacher will provide a link to the form during the meeting
- Students may use a word processing platform (like Google Docs) to develop, organize, and draft their responses before they submit the final response through the Google form





Assessment Task Notes

- Students are encouraged to turn on their cameras during the meeting
- They are asked to keep their microphones muted during the meeting
- Students may unmute or use the chat function to ask questions
- It is not necessary to study or prepare for this assessment task. We do not encourage or endorse any tutors or tutoring companies
- Students are expected to complete the task independently and honestly


Admissions Decisions
