From your Dashboard, click on the Plan Courses button that appears in the High School Progress/Official High School Plan box. The button will say Plan Courses only after course submission has been enabled by Maple High School.

HINT: Clicking on Plan Courses will take you to your High School Planner you can also access this by simply clicking on High School from the left hand navigation menu.


## OPTING OUT OF THE ONLINE LEARNING GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

(For students entering Grades 10 through 12):
The request to opt out can be submitted along with your course selections for next year:

1. You will see an Online Learning Opt-Out box as the first box in your High School Plan for next school year - click this box.

- If you have pre-filled your course selection earlier, you will not see the 'Online Learning Opt-Out' box. Simply remove the course in the first box and it will appear, along with a new course box to re-add your final course.
- If you do not see an 'Online Learning Opt-Out' box under next year, no action is needed - either you have already opted out, or you will be asked to confirm your decision in a later grade.
o If you Opt-Out, you will still able to Opt-in at later date, if so desired.


2. Click on the 'Online Learning Opt-Out' link, and review the information in the description and guidance message.
3. Click Add Course if you wish to opt out of the requirement.

## 1) ADD COURSES FOR NEXT YEAR

- In High School Planner, click + [Course]. This will show you the entire course catalogue.
- Courses can be filtered by Grade or Discipline by adjusting these filters at the top of the courses screen. This will make it easier to see the courses that are appropriate for you.
- If you select a compulsory course (i.e. Math) the compulsory courses in that discipline will appear. The Grade 9 column has been set to display only Grade 9 courses in the course catalogue.


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Grade 10 Course Updates
All students who have completed the destreamed Grade 9 Mathematics (MTH1W) this school year, should be selecting Grade 10 Academic Math (MPM2D). All students who have completed the destreamed Grade 9 Science (SNC1W) this school year, can select either Grade 10 Academic Science (SNC2D) or Grade 10 Applied Science (SNC2P). All students who completed Grade 9 Academic English (ENG1D), can select either Grade 10 Academic English (ENG2D) or Grade 10 Applied English (ENG2P). All students requesting Grade 10 History next school year will be taking Academic History (CHC2D).

Grade 11 Course Updates

All students enrolling in Grade 11 English will be taking English: Understanding Contemporary First Nations, Métis and Inuit Voices. NBE3U1 is the University English Credit (which is the prerequisite for ENG4U - Grade 12 University English), while NBE3C1 is the College English Credit (which is the prerequisite for ENG4C - Grade 12 College English). You will no longer find ENG3U1 (Grade 11 English - University) or ENG3C1 (Grade 11 English - College) in the course catalogue.

Students entering Year 1 of the International Baccalaureate (Grade 11), will select NBE3UZ for their Grade 11 English Credit.

- In the Course Selection and Details screen, explore the available courses.
- Click Add Course when you find the course you want.
- If adding a Music Repertoire (after-school) course or in some cases, Dual Credit courses, it will be entered as your $9^{\text {th }}$ course. After you enter your first eight (8) courses, myPathwayPlanner will display an + [ Repertoire] option to the bottom of your course selection. For Repertoire and Dual Credit courses only, click the new $+[$ Repertoire $]$ bubble and add the correct Repertoire/Dual Credit course to your Official Plan - leave blank otherwise.
- Grade 12 Students are allowed to have 1 spare on their timetable each semester if they have earned 24 credits. MyPathwayPlanner has been set-up to allow Grade 12 students to submit their course selection with only 6 courses. By leaving one or two +[Course] bubbles blank, you are indicating the number of spares you wish to have.
*In Grade 11 and 12, you will also be able to select Day School Online Learning courses as part of your course selection for next year. You would scroll to the 'Online Learning Courses' course folder on the course screen. Once clicking the online learning holding code, you will be prompted to select the course you want from a dropdown menu. These courses would be part of your day school timetable (i.e. would be one or two of the eight courses you would select as part of your course selection). Please note that this is different than Night School Online Learning (which you will register for next year during the school year). To see how to select a Day School Online Learning course, you can watch the video linked here.

HINT: The Graduation Indicator will help you keep track of your progress towards graduation. Click View Progress for a list of specific graduation requirements.

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2) REVIEW COURSES - When you are ready to submit your course selections, click the blue Review Course Selections button and give your course selection one final look over.

3) SUBMIT COURSES - Once you've carefully reviewed the Details page to ensure that you are meeting the requirements for the courses you have selected and that the courses that appear are correct, click on Submit Course Selections. Please note that you will not be able to modify your course selections Submit Course Selections once submitted (unless your Guidance Counsellor re-allows submission)!

## Why is myPathwayPlanner not allowing me to submit my courses?

1. You have not selected enough courses. Grade 9-11 students need to choose 8 courses and are encouraged to choose 2 alternates. Grade 12 students need to choose at least 6 courses and are encouraged to choose 2 alternates.
2. You do not have the required prerequisites (or co-requisites) for the courses you selected. If you do not have the required prerequisites (or co-requisites), myPathwayPlanner will 'red-dot' (prevent) you from submitting your courses. You will need to see a Guidance Counsellor to submit your course selection.

YOU'RE ALMOST DONE! See below on how to get your parent/guardian approval submitted electronically.

To reduce the burden for students of printing and returning course selection sign-off sheets, My Pathway Planner's (myBlueprint's) new online parent/guardian course selection approval allows parent/guardian sign-off to be emailed and approved without requiring a paper form.

## How students send email approval requests to a parent/guardian

1. In My Pathway Planner (myBlueprint), once students submit their courses they are prompted with a Send Approval Email option. Once clicked, a parent or guardian's email address can be added.

2. After entering an email address and clicking Send Approval Email, the parent/guardian receives a course selection approval request email, including:
a. The student's course requests
b. Alternate course requests, if any
c. Issues with course submission, if any (e.g. missing prerequisite, etc.)
d. Student comments, if any
e. Course guidance messages, if any

## Having Trouble Finding Certain Courses?

Some courses may be more difficult to find in myPathwayPlanner as they are grouped by the discipline designated by the Ontario Ministry of Education as opposed to the actual department at Maple High School. It has been set up this way so that your Graduation Indicator in myPathwayPlanner is accurate; it will assist you not only with graduation planning but also in ensuring you have all postsecondary entrance requirements for your desired program(s). This is especially important when using the Postsecondary Search features in myPathwayPlanner.

Below is a chart that will assist in finding courses in myPathwayPlanner.

## Are you planning on taking Summer School?

## Taking Compulsory Credits in Summer School

If you plan on taking compulsory credits (ex. Grade 10 Civics and Careers) in Summer School, click on the compulsory +[Course] bubble you wish to remove in your High School Plan. This will take you to the courses screen. On this screen, there will be 'filters' listed above the courses. The 'discipline' filter will be set to the compulsory subject area you chose (i.e. Career Studies/Civics). Change this filter to the first option available: Discipline. This will allow you to remove the compulsory credit and put any course into your High School Plan for next year.


However, simply removing the compulsory course does NOT register you for summer school. This will take place later in the semester. As well, after submitting your course selection, in the comments section, you are encouraged to tell us your summer school plan. But once again, this does NOT register you for summer school.

## Taking Compulsory/Elective Credits in Summer to Possibly 'Fast-Track'

If you plan on taking a compulsory/elective credit in summer school to possibly fast-track (i.e. taking a Grade 11 course in Summer School so that you can take its Grade 12 counterpart next year), it is possible.

If it is a compulsory course, click on the compulsory +[Course] bubble in your High School Plan you wish to remove. This will take you to the courses screen. On this screen, there will be 'filters' listed above the courses. The 'discipline' filter will be set to the compulsory subject area you chose (ex. English). Change this filter to the first option available: Discipline. This will allow you to remove the compulsory credit and put any course into your High School Plan for which you will have the prerequisite after Summer School. (See graphic above). However, simply removing the compulsory course does NOT register you for summer school. This will take place later in the semester.

If it is an elective course, choose any bubble marked +[Course] in your High School Plan and enter the course you wish to take for next year for which you will have the prerequisite after Summer School. However, this does NOT register you for summer school. This will be done later in the semester.
$\rightarrow$ In both fast-tracking situations, if you plan on taking a prerequisite course in summer school to be ready for the following course in August, myPathway Planner will 'red-dot' (prevent) you from submitting your courses. Why? Because it thinks you do not have the required prerequisites because summer school courses are currently not tracked in myPathway Planner. You will need to see a Guidance Counsellor to submit your course selection.
