SAT INFORMATION SHEET

What is the SAT and why should I write it?

The SAT is the most widely used entrance exam for undergraduate study in the U.S. and is increasingly being used by universities around the world. It helps students show universities what they know and how they can apply it. Plus it tests the same knowledge and skills taught in school such as reading, writing and math.

Why should I write the SAT prior to my Grade 12 year?

Writing the test prior to your Grade 12 year will allow you to become accustomed to the test and its requirements. Students are encouraged to write the test several times in order to gain practice. Colleges and universities understand that students may write the test more than once.

What does it cost to take the SAT?

As an "international student", you must pay the regular \$60 US test fee and a \$43 US international processing fee. This fee is paid when you register for the test.

Please Note: The SAT is moving to a digital format. The Oct & Dec test dates are the last 2 times that the paper and pencil test will be offered in Canada. Starting Spring 2023, all International tests will be digital.

What to expect from the Digital SAT:

- You will still need to go to a test center location
- The test will still be proctored in-person (to check ID, provide tech support, etc.)
- The test can be taken on a laptop or tablet
- You can use your own device or one provided by the test center
- The test will be streamlined to a 2 hour test instead of a 3 hour test (shorter sections, fewer questions, shorter reading passages, fewer math word problems, built in graphing calculator, reduced fatigue)
- The digital test is Computer Adaptive (adapts to the test taker as they progress through the test)
- Scoring is not based on just correct questions, but also difficulty level of the questions
