Thank you to all the parents and caregivers who came out last Thursday and Friday to take part in your child's student-led conference. Hopefully you heard about progess made so far this term and the goals that have been set to steer your child toward success at the Term 1 Report Card. If you were unable to attend for any reason, please give the teacher a call.

Our staff, with the leadership of Mrs. Richmond and Mrs. Zimmerman, organized our first annual Vendor Fair. Members of our local community came out to sell their wares. We had a great time connecting with Maple Leaf staff of past years and MLPS families. We raised almost enough money from this event to pay for Rocks and Rings which will give all Maple Leaf students an initial experience learning about the Canadian sport of Curling.

You will have noticed we have a mobile unit that was brought to the school on Friday. Maple Leaf is one of only 5 schools in Ontario to have the privilege of this partnership with the Dairy Farmers of Ontario. Students in our grade 4 classes will learn about healthy food choices and are cooking baked falafels.

We are excited to begin the Roots of Empathy Program again this year. Mrs. Leone will be leading this work in partnership with Ms. Thornhill and Mrs. O'Brien for the students in rooms 132 and 113. "Roots of Empathy is an evidence-based classroom program that has shown significant effect in reducing levels of aggression among school children while raising social/emotional competence and increasing empathy. The mission is to build caring, peaceful and civil societies through the development of empathy in children and adults. The program has at its heart a neighbourhood infant and parent who engage students in their classroom nine times over the school year. A ROE-trained instructor coaches the students to observe the baby's development and to label the baby's feelings. In this experiential learning, the baby is 'teacher' and catalyst for instruction to help children identify and reflect on their own feelings and the feelings of others – empathy."

If you have not yet signed the consent form for The Recess Project, we are hoping to have every child return their form so that we can get the site facilitator hired and begin the recess activites as soon as possible. Copies are available in the office.

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French Immersion Information Sessions and Registrations

Information sessions for the French Immersion (FI) program will take place at French Immersion schools on January 18, 2018 at 7 p.m. Please visit YRDSB's website in January 2018 (http://www.yrdsb.ca/Programs/fi/Pages/Program-Locations.aspx) to find the FI program location for your elementary school location. FI registration will begin January 19, 2018. Parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students entering Grade 1 in 2018, and wishing to enrol in the FI Program, can visit or call the school office and request an *Office Index Card - short version*. The Office Index Card must be signed by the principal of the home school. Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to the designated FI program location to register between January 19 and February 9, 2018. This eliminates the need to provide duplicate enrollment information or to pre-register.

YRDSB's FI Accommodation Plan provides long-term consistency and equity of access to all students in York Region and will enable YRDSB to continue to offer the FI program to all who wish to enrol. The FI program will be offered in Dual Track or Single Track settings, in a variety of configurations. In order to meet community needs and optimize available space in our schools, a community's Grade 1-8 FI program may be provided over more than one school during the course of a student's FI education. Space requirements at some schools may mean that siblings are in different schools for primary dual track French Immersion programs due to differing grade structures. Like any of our schools across the Board, changes to school boundaries, and/or the accommodation model for the French Immersion program may need to be considered when new schools open, a school experiences enrolment growth, and program changes occur. This will allow flexibility in addressing community needs and the opportunity to use existing space in schools.

Please note: Some of the FI accommodation plans will require facility modifications or the development of new schools and will require short-term transition plans that might include overflow while we work toward the long-term vision. Overflow refers to situations in which the Board directs students to attend a school other than their community school or optional program for a specific period of time, as defined in Policy #108.

Kindergarten Registration to Commence January 19, 2018

Kindergarten registration will commence on January 19, 2018 for the 2018-19 school year. Registration forms are available on YRDSB's website: <u>www.yrdsb.ca</u>. Children who turn four or five years old during 2018, live within the school boundary and whose parents are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for kindergarten.
