#### ATTENDANCE

In person attendance for all MANDATORY face-to-face activities at the scheduled date, time and location is required. No exceptions allowed for MANDATORY events.

A minimum of 8-10 hours of study time per day is required. 1 course = 8-10 hrs/DAY At most **1 full credit course** may be taken during the summer session.

Centreline Flexible Sign Program in School Zones

Please be advised that the City will be initiating its annual Centreline Flexible Sign Program at 32 school Zones across the City this spring, pending suitable weather conditions.

The Program is aimed at increasing driver awareness and reducing vehicle speeds approaching school zones. The installation of the signs narrow the travel lane and create a traffic calming effect, thereby reducing vehicle speeds as they approach the school zone on Church Street. Evaluation of prior installations has confirmed that the devices are equally effective as other traditional traffic calming initiatives.— City of Markham

Young Entrepreneurs, Make your Pitch, Markham Business Plan Competition, and Ontario Summer Company. These opportunities are aimed at fostering youth entrepreneurial spirit.

#### Waterloo Financial Literacy Competition:

Each semester the University of Waterloo holds a financial literacy competition which is open to students who have or are currently enrolled in BBI2O1 - Introduction to Business. The contest which will be held on May 14, 2019, during school hours is open to Grade 9, 10 and 11 students and offers prizes at two levels; Junior (Grades 9 and 10) and Senior (Grade 11). Students will be challenged with 60 questions (primarily multiple choice, sort/match/rank, fill in the blank) in 60 minutes covering financial literacy topics in the areas of accounting, economics, investing, banking, budgeting and income management, credit, home ownership, post-secondary education financing and financial safety and ethics.

# School Bus Cancellation Notice

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries which prevents the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the moming, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation hom e.
